BOARD CERTIFICATION IN INVESTIGATIONS



THE PROFESSIONAL CERTIFIED INVESTIGATOR (PCI) designation is a specialty certification awarded to security practitioners who have demonstrated knowledge and experience in case management, evidence collection, and preparation of reports and testimony to substantiate findings. Those who have earned the PCI are ASIS board certified in investigations.

The PCI is evidence of specialized skills in security investigations, including case evaluation and review of options for case management strategies. The credential confirms an individual's ability to collect information through the effective use of surveillance, interviews, and interrogations. Among other skills, PCIs have demonstrated qualifications in physical and electronic research and data analysis.

Are you eligible?

You are eligible to apply for the PCI if you have:

- five (5) years of investigations experience, with at least two (2) years in case management, and
- an earned high school diploma or GED equivalent.
