NOTE :

1. All activities must relate to security as defined by the content specifications of the relevant examination. Eligible activities include those for a charitable, religious, governmental or community entity that is performed pro-bono. Examples are security audits of public school building; security plan for fundraising march or other large activity; evaluation of emergency management for public agency.
