The following areas were discussed:

26th Annual Government/Industry Conference on Global Terrorism (17-19 Mar 08 at the Ritz-Carlton Pentagon City, Alexandria, VA).

- Capt Dawn Bolyard briefed that her presentation went well. She felt there was a good exchange of information on the role of the National Guard as a whole. She also briefed that it would have been more advantageous if she had a more complete understanding of the audience much sooner in her presentation development process.
- Mr. Sam Brinkley briefed his presentation was well received. He stated overall this year's conference was more encompassing of the terrorism landscape, and not just a basic "Terrorism101." He also discussed that attendance at the Global Terrorism Conference has been steadily decreasing the past few years. This year there was only approximately 80 attendees.

Emerging Trends in Security Seminar (19-21 May 08 in Las Vegas)

- Joe Rector reminder presenters that they need to upload their presentations to the ASIS website by COB 25 April. He had sent an email to all reps on 31 March with instructions on the website. Alternatively, presenters can email their presentations to Tanya Kirchner at tkirchner@asisonline.org. If the presentation is large, it would be best to upload it to the website.
- Our sessions are scheduled for Monday, 19 May, at 0930-1030 and 1100-1200. Session one will feature presentations by the Army, Navy, Marine Corps and the Coast Guard. Session two will feature presentations from the Air Force, National Guard Bureau and the Canadian Armed Forces. The session will wrap up with a question and answer period with all representatives present

ASIS Annual Seminar and Exhibits

- Joe Rector briefed the results of the Annual Seminar selection review committee held on 6-7 March 2008. Our Changing and Emerging Face of Military Security for 2008 proposal was approved as submitted and will follow the same format as the Emerging Trends Seminar. Part 1 will be on Wednesday, 17 September, 1100-1200 and will feature 15 minute presentations by the USN, USMC, USCG, and US Army. Part 2 will also be on Wednesday, 17 September, 1630-1730 and will feature 15 minute presentations by the USAF, NGB and the Canadian Armed Forces. It will wrap up with a 15 minute question and answer period with all service reps present. The proposals for our Military Police/Security Operations in Iraq/Afghanistan were modified and approved. The sessions will be laid out into 2-90 minute sessions. Part One will be held on Monday, 15 September, 1330-1500 and will feature 20 minute presentations by the Navy, Marine Corps, Coast Guard and Army. . Session Two will be held on Tuesday, 16 September, 1330-1500 and will feature 20 minute presentations by the Air Force, National Guard Bureau, and the Canadian Armed Forces followed by a question and answer period with all service/component reps present. We anticipate a 1 August 2008 suspense for presentations and speaker biographies.

Military Appreciation Committee Update

- David Ramirez briefed planning to bring the traveling Vietnam Memorial to the Miami area is preceding well. Greg Steele is still working to set up a teleconference with Kathleen Kiernan, Council VP, and ASIS HQ to discuss the best approach for the annual seminar.

MLC Way Ahead

- Greg Steele briefed that the USCG had a representative at OPM. This rep has provided him a POC in the OPM standards office to discuss standards and measures for the 080 security series. Although he has left several messages, the POC has not returned his calls. He will continue to try to make contact.

- Greg Steele briefed he has received some comments and suggestions concerning his draft survey. He will make some revisions and forward out to the MLC membership for review prior to going final.

- CMSgt Brent Belcoff briefed the Air Force financial functional on the Air Staff have stated the AF cannot pay for certifications for civilian employees. He is researching further with the OSD staff, but is not getting clear cut answers.
