MISSION STATEMENT

OBJECTIVES:

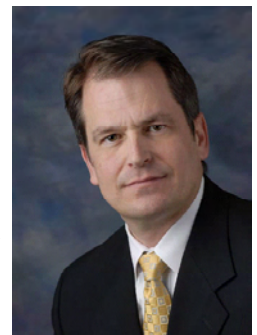
JAMES C. TAFF, CPP

VINCENT RUFFOLO, CEO

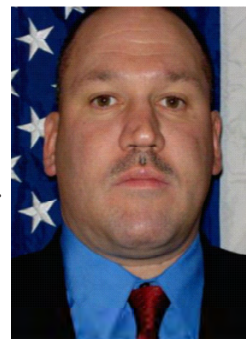
COUNCIL MEMBER SINCE 2000

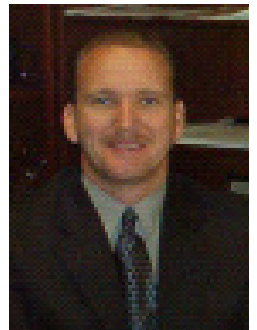


ROCCO L. DEFELICE, CPP
