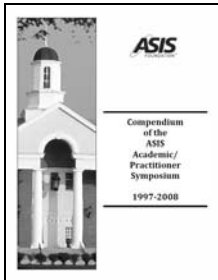

## ASIS Academic Practitioner Symposium

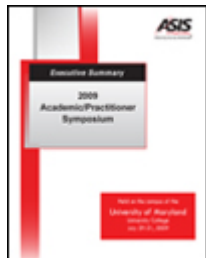
The Symposium is a forum for promoting continuing communication between security academicians and security practitioners. Participants at this invitation-only event gather annually for an intensive, multi-day program of plenary sessions, guest speakers, and dynamic breakout sessions, during which they discuss and debate industry issues and trends, and take actions geared to the advancement of security education at the baccalaureate and graduate levels. Each Symposium builds off previous years' work. Past Symposiums have resulted in course outlines, curriculum models, core competencies, and potential accreditation criteria, among other products. The 2009 Symposium takes place July 29-31 at the University of Maryland. David H. Gilmore, CPP, chairs the Symposium. The Vice Chairman is Dr. Carl T. Richards.

The Symposium is conducted in coordination with the ASIS International, Council on Academic Programs in Colleges and Universities, with funding support through the ASIS Foundation, and administrative support from the Research and Development Department at ASIS International Headquarters.
