Submissions must be written in English and follow accepted standards for academic papers.

Requirements:

- ◆ Between 3,000 and 6,000 words, not including appendices or attachments
- ◆ Times New Roman, Book Antiqua, or Arial 12-point font (tables, charts & footnotes may use smaller font size)
- ◆ Illustrations, charts, tables, and graphs that reinforce content are acceptable but don't apply towards word count requirements
- ◆ 1½ or double-spaced
- ◆ Use of recognized styles, such as APA, Chicago/Turabian, or MLA
