ASIS BOARD CERTIFICATIONS:

Certified Protection Professional (CPP)

Provides independent confirmation of your ability to assume leadership responsibilities and effectively manage broad security concerns.

Professional Certified Investigator (PCI)

Provides independent confirmation of specialized skills in security investigations, including case evaluation and review of options for case management strategies.

Physical Security Professional (PSP)

Provides independent confirmation of expertise in conducting physical security surveys to identify vulnerabilities and performing a cost analysis for the selection of integrated physical measures.
