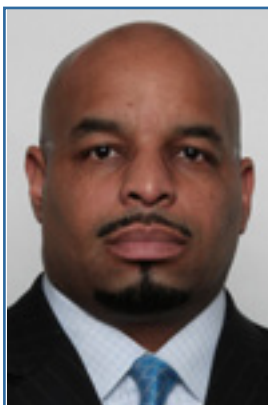

June Meetings in Orlando Florida for Exam-Related Activities

Dual IDG Meetings for CPP and PCI

The PCB will hold dual item development group (IDG) meetings for the CPP and PCI exams in Orlando, FL from June 2-4, 2011. Prior to the meetings in Florida, CPP and PCI certification volunteer teams will use remote item writing (RIW) software to submit draft questions for review by the respective PCB Designation Committees. Once the RIW process is completed, the designation teams will meet in Florida to work, under the guidance of PES, to undertake the task of evaluating items/questions submitted by writers. The PCB's aim is to eventually move to a process that allows ongoing item writing and in doing so, will require the support of many ASIS certified volunteers who qualify to participate. Having excellent representation from subject-matter experts is truly a great benefit and adds to the continued success of the certification programs. Please be on the lookout for more details about eligibility requirements for participating in ongoing item writing in the next PCB newsletter.

PSP Meeting

In addition to item writing, the PCB designation committees will also conduct a PSP pass point study meeting. This will determine the passing point for new test forms that will be administered beginning in November 2011. The pass point (or passing score) establishes the number of examination questions that must be answered correctly in order to meet the "minimum competency" certification standard.

Important Reminder - PSP Update Announcement!

The PSP Test Forms & Reference Materials to be updated in November 2011.

ASIS International has announced important 2011 updates to the eligibility, exam, and reference requirements for the Physical Security Professional (PSP) certification. These changes will take effect on November 7, 2011.

Please note that PSP passing requirements have not changed at all, but the exam content has been updated based on the new job analysis. The change in eligibility requirements and exam content is reflective of physical security professionals, who are more experienced and/or exposed to increasingly advanced concepts. It also ensures that the exam is on par with employer requirements and enhances the worldwide value of all ASIS certified professionals. Such program enhancements are expected as industries expand and candidates are required to demonstrate competence in specified tasks.

Coming Soon – PCB Award Nominations!

Now is the time to start preparing your list of nominations for individual and organizational award recipients! The PCB will begin accepting certification award nominations during the first week of April 2011. Award recipients will be recognized by their local chapter and announced in ASIS Dynamics, certification newsletters, on the website, and during the 2011 ASIS International Annual Seminar and Exhibits in Orlando, FL.
