The Council promotes security education provided at accredited, degree-granting institutions of higher learning as well as effective security training development and delivery in government and industry.



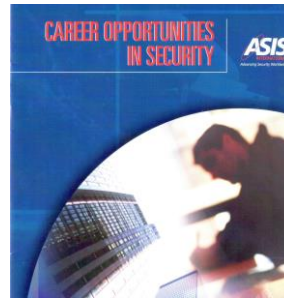


Council Goals
