The ASIS International Singapore Chapter held its second field visit of the year at the Singapore Turf Club (STC) on June 30. The event was attended by 33 members, and is part of a year-long series of educational visits to organizations of interest. Previous visits have included both government and commercial organizations such as the Internal Security Department, Singapore Airlines, and more recently Facebook and Twitter.

Led by Mr Kelvin Yiew, an assistant manager (security) at STC, members were given a briefing on STC's corporate history, mission and operations. Other than hosting races, the STC also organizes other social and family-friendly activities annually to include the broader community, and regularly makes significant financial contributions to the less privileged.

Among its roles and functions, members quickly learnt that the Security Department has a very challenging task at this sprawling 120-hectare site, particularly during race days. Their role includes not just security deployment and anti-bookmaking operations, but also helping to ensure the all-important integrity of horse racing. At STC, typical challenges faced by the team during race days include the safety of a mostly ageing customer base, unhappy customers who have lost money on betting, and customers with pre-existing medical conditions unknown to security personnel on the ground.

Members thoroughly enjoyed this field visit which included a tour around the STC with the rare opportunity to visit the Jockey Room, pre-race restricted areas, and the Security Command Centre. It was not just an eye opener but another opportunity to learn security management in such an operating environment. With the question and answer session facilitated by its assistant vice president (investigation & operations research), Mr Koh Lian Thye, who has a wealth of experience at STC and as a retired senior police officer, this visit was another resounding success. The chapter members are already looking forward to the next one.



Enterprise Security Risk Management

'Learning The Business': ESRM for Practising Security Professionals



Last November, ASIS International – the largest global organisation for security management professionals with 242 chapters and 35,000 members worldwide – proposed Enterprise Security Risk Management as a global strategic priority for the organisation. ways. Also, the rapidly evolving business and compliance landscape requires somewhat more holistic and strategic approach towards managing organisational risk. As the only global professional association representing the spectrum of security, ASIS International is uniquely positioned to lead this a new Era.

ESRM allows today's traditional security issues such as data protection and terrorism, but also a broad array of topics including them brand protection, business continuity, corporate espionage, cyber security, information security, real-time and white collar crime. It requires practitioners to continuously assess the full range of emerging risks posed to the organisation, as well as within the enterprise's entire portfolio of assets. The end goal is to identify and effectively manage the protection of an organisation's enterprise-wide assets, thereby enabling the focus to move from reactive to proactive.

ASIS International's involvement in Enterprise Security Risk Management (ESRM) can be traced back to early on with the creation of the Alliance for Enterprise Security Risk Management (AESRM) in tandem with the Information Systems Audit and Control Association (ISACA) and the Information Systems Security Association (ISSA).

The AESRM was specifically designed to bring both Board and executive level attention to critical security-related issues and the need for a comprehensive approach to protect the enterprise. Subsequently, the AESRM produced several White Papers and other thought leadership documents, while ASIS has since covered ESRM in scores of articles, seminar sessions, presentations and courses. That said, the topic was never treated as a strategic priority for the organisation until last November.

Both a philosophy and a management system, ESRM uses globally established risk management principles to help security professionals manage the overall security risk facing their organisations. By making ESRM a strategic objective, ASIS International is looking to shift the profession from a siloed approach for security management towards a more collaborative process.

David Davis, CPP, the president of ASIS in 2016 and this year's chairman of the Board, has stated: "Today's threats are increasingly more sophisticated, targeting organisations in myriad

Apple sets up China Data Center to Meet New Cybersecurity Rules



Apple Inc said it is setting up its first data center in China, in partnership with a local internet services company, to comply with tougher cybersecurity laws introduced last month. The U.S. technology company said it will build the center in the southern province of Guizhou with data management firm Guizhou-Cloud Big Data Industry Co Ltd (GCBD). An Apple spokesman in Shanghai told Reuters the center is part of a planned \$1 billion investment into the province.
