### ASIS Malaysia Talk Enterprise Security Risk Management

On May 22, the ASIS International Malaysia Chapter organized a presentation on Enterprise Security Risk Management (ESRM) at the Malaysian International Chamber of Commerce and Industries (MICCI) in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. Members of the Joint Action Security Committee or JASCO, which is a security group under MICCI, attended the talk together with ASIS Malaysia chapter members. Siti Subaidah Adil, head of programs for the ASIS Malaysia chapter, provided a short introduction on the benefits and value of membership with ASIS International.

The main presentation was delivered by Leonard Sng, CPP, ASIS International regional vice president. Sng has acquired vast experience in the corporate security field for the past 22 years, whilst being with both the private and public sectors both in Singapore and in the wider region.

Sng's presentation focused on ESRM approaches that help to reduce the likelihood and impact of organizational risks. He also suggested appropriate response and recovery processes, should an event occur. The attendees were led through a simple step-by-step "walk-through" to identify organizational security risks and how to provide the organizational management with a practical mitigation plan to address such risks. Sng stressed that this type of contribution by organizational security professionals will be an added-value and will help to diminish the age-old perception that security means just gates, guards, and guns.

The attendees, who hailed from both multinational industries and corporations in Malaysia, participated actively and several of them enquired if the ESRM approach can be applied to their unique environments and how they might get management support. The presentation also provided insight on how ASIS International contributes toward the development of security professionals with new and creative concepts in coping with enterprise security risks.

ASIS Victoria Australia guests enjoyed a hot breakfast on a cold Melbourne morning and heard from two leading professionals in public safety: Sergeant Wayne Gatt (Victoria Police) and Cathy Rhodes (Crime Stoppers).

First, Sergeant Gatt, secretary of the Victoria Police Association, offered insight into the impact policing can have on its members and how the association has turned to modern technology through the use of a free well-being app. The app (Equipt) was developed by The Police Association and Victoria Police, with the input from members and leading health professionals to help with developing healthy and sustainable lifestyle practices, managing stressful situations, and getting support when needed.

Cathy Rhodes, general manager of Crime Stoppers Victoria, discussed the history of Crime Stoppers-recently celebrating 30 years of community safety-and the vital work the organization plays in assisting police to reduce crime and make Victoria a safer place. Since starting in 1987, Crime Stoppers Victoria has taken more than 870,000 calls, helped in more than 20,000 arrests, collected information to lay more than 80,000 charges, and assisted in the recovery of more than \$212 million in property, drugs, and stolen items.

Crime Stoppers Victoria is a not for profit organisation that relies on the support of the community and the generosity of supporters to continue its vital work.

Leonard Ong, CPP, and Werner Preining, CPP, both active ASIS International Information Technology Security and Crisis Management and Business Continuity council members, attended the 2017 Euro CACS-ISACA conference in Munich, Germany. Besides widening their horizon on multiple, converging disciplines, they gave a joint presentation, titled "Organizational Resilience for the Changing World."

Around 50 participants joined the session and the content was very well received. The presentation was an opportunity to briefly introduce ASIS International which was important because the attendees, from U.S., European and Asian backgrounds, were not well informed about the organization.

Preining introduced the audience to the new ASIS ANSI Standard, "Organizational Resilience in Organizations and their Supply Chain", explaining the proactive approach of the standard to enhance sustainability, survivability, and resilience for supporting the process of prevention, protection, preparedness, readiness, mitigation, response, continuity, and recovery from undesirable and disruptive events.

Ong subsequently navigated the present state of cybersecurity, the threat horizon until 2019, and the Society's way forward with key takeaways for the audience.

The presenters emphasized the importance of the new standard within globalized enterprises with an absolute dependency on IT and the necessity of a strong crisis management and business security plan to stay resilient.



## Nominees for ASIS International's 2017 Security Book of the Year Award

The O.P. Norton Information Resources Center (IRC) and the ASIS Security Book Award Committee are pleased to announce the following nominees for the ASIS 2017 Security Book of the Year Award:

**Managing Critical Incidents, Eloy Nunez and Dr. Ernest G. Vendrell, CPP; published by CRC Press, 2016.**

**Physical Security: 150 Things You Should Know, 2nd ed., Lawrence Fennelly and Marianna Perry, CPP; published by Butterworth Heinemann, 2016.**

The ASIS Book Award Committee, comprised of ASIS members who are established authors, editors, and reviewers, examined security books published in 2016 by ASIS members. The nominated titles are reviewed, using thirteen criteria. The committee votes anonymously and confidentially by electronic ballot.

Almost two dozen titles were eligible for this year's award, which is in its fourth consecutive year. This award was inaugurated in 2014 by the IRC and the ASIS Crime Prevention Council to recognize published writers among ASIS membership and their contributions to the profession as well as to the publishing field.

The winner of the 2017 Security Book of the Year will be announced in July 2017. The book award will be presented at the 63rd Annual ASIS Seminar and Exhibits in Dallas, Texas, on Monday morning September 25th, in the Seminar Bookstore. Seminar attendees are invited to this Bookstore event, where the winning author(s) will be available to sign copies of their book.

To be eligible for the next ASIS Security Book of the Year, a security book must be authored by an ASIS member and published between January 1 and December 31, 2017. ### Manila Attack Has Exposed Worrying Gaps in Security



Fears have been expressed for the safety of public facilities in Manila after a lone gunman was able to enter an upscale casino and hotel complex with an M4 carbine and gasoline, firing shots and setting fire to gaming tables before immolating himself. Thirty-six bodies were found in the wake of the brazen attack on Resorts World Manila, which took place in the early hours of June 2. The Metropolitan Manila police chief told AP that most victims had suffocated from smoke inhalation. According to a statement from Resorts World, 30 people were brought by its security team to hospital for medical attention. The *Manila Bulletin* reported that 54 people were hurt when they jumped for safety.

### Organizational and IT Complexities Put Most Businesses in India At Risk

A global study by Citrix and Ponemon Institute titled *The Need for a New IT Security Architecture* reveals that 91 percent of businesses in India say their organization is at risk because of the complexity of business and IT operations, which is above the APJ average of 85 percent and the global average of 83 percent. The report also covers global trends in IT security risks and reasons why security practices and policies need to evolve in order to deal with threats from disruptive technologies, cybercrime and compliance. As a country in the throes of digitization, cybersecurity is one of the most hotly debated topics in India and according to research firm Gartner, the IT security market in India is estimated to grow up to \$1.24 billion in 2017.

The unprecedented attack of the ISIS-backed militant group Maute Group in Marawi City in Mindanao, the Philippines, could mark the beginning of a new threat to Southeast Asian maritime security. The Maute group, also known as the Islamic State of Lanao, is a radical Islamist group composed of former Moro Islamic Liberation Front guerrillas and some foreign fighters led by Abdullah Maute, the alleged founder of a Dawlah Islamiya, or Islamic State based in Lanao del Sur, Mindanao, Philippines.
