He was active in founding the ASIS Hong Kong Chapter and served as its first chair.

This award is named in Grove's memory in recognition of his contribution to the security industry in the Asia-Pacific Region, and his desire to nurture the security professionals of the future.

Western Australia Chapter and OSAC Meet at Perth Airport

At times of civil disorder and uncertainty, public and private security sectors must come together and develop the necessary relationships to ensure communication and information sharing with frontline officers -- be they police, security, medical, or emergency services. The ASIS International Western Australia Chapter has developed a strong partnership with the U.S. Department of State Overseas Advisory Committee (OSAC) after signing a formal MOU in 2015.

The chapter has initiated a number of special security briefings on active shooters and counterterrorism requirements. The most recent, hosted by Perth Airport, provided assurance that agencies are engaging, communicating, planning, and have the capacity to respond. Held a week after the Istanbul airport attack, the joint ASIS and OSAC luncheon was attended by more than 80 state and federal police agencies, the U.S. State Department, and Perth security and facility management professionals. Importantly, the meetings made allowances for university students studying security science to attend and learn, providing the basis of the profession moving forward over the next decade.

To sound a positive note, these meetings also demonstrate women in security are active, with Perth Airport, Australian Federal Police, and ASIS having a number of senior women active in assisting with these events and security planning. With the terrorism threat real and probable, there are mentoring responsibilities for all security professionals, so it would be that any senior personnel who is not mentoring at least one or two students or junior members is not sufficiently

Security Week is designed to educate small businesses, community leaders, and organizations without the resources to build safe initiatives on the fundamentals of preparedness and protecting soft targets, such as schools. The initiative will be a valuable component of the ASIS Seminar and Exhibits moving forward, leaving the ASIS Host Committees with expertise on emergency planning and safety.

Supported by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security Office of Infrastructure Protection, Security Week was developed in response to the worldwide violent attacks being carried out where citizens work and gather. China's Floating Nuclear Reactors Plans Spur Attack Concerns

Two state-owned companies plan to develop floating nuclear reactors, which technology engineers have been considering since the 1970s for use by oil rigs or island communities. Beijing is racing Russia, which started developing its own in 2007, to get a unit into commercial operation. "The security concerns are clear: such reactors would be tempting targets for military or terrorist attacks," said Edwin Lyman, a nuclear specialist for the Union of Concerned Scientists in Washington D.C. "Maintaining the full contingent of security officers necessary to effectively deter attack would not be feasible."


Army Chief Assures Security for China-Pakistan Economic Corridor

Pakistani Army Chief General Raheel Sharif has vowed to ensure security for the ongoing China Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) project. Work is under way in Pakistan for construction of the road and railway network envisaged under the CPEC project besides an energy project that have drawn investments worth \$46 billion from China. He added that the CPEC was a strategic game-changer not just for Pakistan but for the entire region. "It is destined to bring significant improvement in the lives of hundreds of millions of people, besides further promoting mutual interdependence among regional states," he added.

ASIS Europe 2017 will take place from March 29 to 31, 2017, at the MiCo Conference Centre in central Milan, Italy.


ASIS International members can expect the high-quality content that ASIS Europe is known for, with more options to attend than ever before.
