ASIS Holds Inaugural China Conference in Shanghai

On December 3 and 4, the inaugural ASIS China conference took place at the Crowne Plaza Shanghai. The ASIS China Conference was the first full-scale educational event for security professionals in Mainland China held under the auspices of the world's largest association for security professionals. With some 150 attendees from 18 countries, the conference was sold out.

ASIS President-Elect David C. Davis, CPP, opened the conference and was followed by an informative keynote presentation of former diplomat and Chatham House Scholar Dr. Tim Summers who spoke on "China 2020: will the reforms work?" Dave Davis also presented the Dan Grove APAC Regional Scholarship for emerging security professional to Garrhett Thomas from Perth, Australia. This was followed by a range of presentations including Patrick Wang, Head of Security Asia at Bekaert who spoke on



On behalf of ASIS International, I am saddened to report the loss of my father, Leonard Wolfgang Baltissen, a past chair of the Jakarta, Indonesia Chapter. My father's first job was in mechanical engineering for a private company in Indonesia. After several years working for different companies, in 1986 he joined PT Indocement Tunggul Prakarsa, the second largest cement producing company in Indonesia and worked there until 2008. He began his career in the Engineering Department and then transferred to the Security Department, where he was eventually promoted to security manager. He joined ASIS in 2005 and retired in 2008.

Afterward, in 2009, my father was elected as chair of the Jakarta Chapter by all members. He organized a number of trainings, campaigns, and assessments to improve security management systems in Indonesia and was also actively involved in Indonesian security communities and with other security associations in Indonesia promoting the welfare of Indonesian security guards.

My father introduced ASIS standards and guidelines to security communities in Indonesia to improve security management systems and the knowledge of ASIS. Major companies in Indonesia acknowledged his skill and knowledge in security management and relied on him as a security consultant. His friends and colleagues regarded him as a good teacher and a true friend as he always shared his knowledge for the purpose of improvement. His family will always remember him as a devoted breadwinner. He always did his best to achieve the improvement of security competence in Indonesia.

Earlier this year, my father suffered a cardiac arrest just few hours after teaching a security course in Surabaya and died a number of days later. I may have lost a father, but Indonesia has lost a key figure in security management.

ASIS Mumbai Chapter Meeting Report

The ASIS International Mumbai Chapter meeting was held on 9 October, 2015, at Bharat Diamond Bourse. The chapter was honoured by the presence of Anoop Mehta, president of Bharat Diamond Bourse, who shared his views about the security industry in Mumbai. He said he appreciated all the efforts by the chapter in providing a platform to all security professionals in Mumbai to share knowledge and experience and offered his support for all chapter activities.

Wilfred Bradford, chapter vice chair, extended a warm welcome to all the members, shared the chapter updates, spoke about the extensive coverage the chapter received in *Asia-Pacific Dynamics* in 2015, and encouraged all members to write articles. Sanjeev Tiwari, chapter treasurer, shared updates about the Certified Protection Professional ® (CPP) review and encouraged other security professionals to join the certification program. Paul Devassy, India assistant regional vice president, discussed developments in ASIS India projects and also spoke about the creation of a new ASIS chapter in Bengaluru. Suraj Shankhpal, chapter secretary, reiterated the agenda points for the meeting, which included two educational sessions.

The first, by Pawan Desai, explained the concept of risk assessment and the role it plays in protecting people, processes, and property. He elaborated on various best practices on risk assessment based on international standards and guidelines and how

they can be implemented. Pawan also shared an overview of the risk assessment program at Desai's company, MitKat, and explained how it assists his clients to make the right business decisions. Several case studies were followed by a question-and-answer session.

The second presentation was from Wilfred Bradford, director at Deloitte and chapter vice chair, on brand protection in India -- a topic currently gaining momentum in India. He explained the concept of brand protection and how the biggest brands in India have been impacted by counterfeiting. He also mentioned that the risk is not limited to reputational impact, there is also an effect on health and safety, as pharmaceutical, automobile, beverage, and other FMCG companies are battling with many counterfeit products in the market. Bradford also explored the various legislations in India that are relevant for IPR, trademark, and other brand-related contraventions. He also pointed out that, effectively, all security professionals are their companies brand protectors.



Concluding the meeting, Devassy thanked the hosts Samir Jha and the entire team of Bharat Diamond Bourse for hosting the chapter meeting. Following the meeting, participants proceeded for high tea organized by the host to continue networking.

New Standards Technical Committee Under Formation

ASIS International has embarked on the development of a new American National Standard for Security and Resilience in Organizations and their Supply Chains (ORM.1). A revision and consolidation of the existing Organizational Resilience and Business Continuity Management standards, this new standard will provide steps necessary to prevent, prepare for, and respond to an undesirable or disruptive incident; prevent, manage, and survive the event; and take actions to ensure an organization and its supply chain's resilience.

Technical committee formation is now open through Friday, December 18, 2015. To participate, please submit the [ORM.1 Application](#) by December 18th to standards@asisonline.org . Applications received after the deadline may not be accepted. Committee inclusion will be based on a first-come basis and only fully completed application forms will be considered.

Before applying to the ORM Committee, please review the [New Member Guidebook](#) to understand the process, roles, responsibilities, time commitment, and other expectations involved.

Only one voting representative per organization is allowed; therefore organizations

should coordinate representation to avoid duplication in application submissions. Where more than one application per organization is received, a voting alternate or observer can be appointed.

ASIS membership is not a requirement for participation, however, membership composition of the ORM.1 Technical Committee must be balanced across interest categories based on ANSI requirements, and consideration may be given to committee size.

Once the ORM.1 Technical Committee is formed, an e-mail confirmation details of the next steps will be sent.

Top China Cop Targets Bankers After Locking Up Security Czar

The high-ranking cop who brought down one of China's top Communist Party officials has been put in charge of a corruption probe of the securities industry in the wake of a summer stock crash, said a person familiar with the matter.

The appointment of Fu Zhenghua underscores the importance that President Xi Jinping has given the investigation into possible securities fraud linked to the \$5 trillion wipeout in June and July. Fu has had several promotions since Xi came to power in 2012, and oversaw the case against former Politburo Standing Committee member Zhou Yongkang, said three people familiar with the case, who asked not to be identified because Fu's role hasn't been made public. Zhou was sentenced to life behind bars in June.

Indonesia Could Face Terror Attack in Near Future



Indonesian authorities are stepping up security measures because of the threat of a possible terrorist attack in the near future, the country's top security minister has warned.

"We have information about a possible terror attack in the near future. That's why we are preparing all authorities," Coordinating Minister for Political, Legal, and Security Affairs Luhut Panjaitan said.

Luhut did not provide any details about the threat, but urged people to stay alert. Specifically, Luhut said authorities would increase vigilance at airports, seaports and other vital objects.

China Gang Targets Hong Kong Media via Dropbox

A gang linked to China and alleged to be responsible for targeted attacks against foreign governments and ministries, has now pointed its focus inward at China's autonomous territory Hong Kong. An August attack against several media companies in Hong Kong was carried out shortly after a high-profile controversy over an appointment at the prestigious Hong Kong University.

This is not the first time China has targeted media outlets, especially in Hong Kong, in particular seeking out journalists' sources and attempting to stay ahead of a news cycle. In January 2013, hackers allegedly connected to the Chinese government were blamed by Mandiant for a breach at the *New York Times*. The group targeted the e-mail accounts of investigative journalists looking into alleged corruption involving then-Chinese premier Wen Jiabao.

Five Security Personnel Injured in Naxal Ambush

Five security personnel, including two STF jawans, were injured when Naxals ambushed a team of security forces in the restive jungles of Chhattisgarh's insurgency-hit Sukma district, police said.

Police also claimed to have gunned down at least 15 ultras in the skirmish although no bodies were recovered from the spot.

"The exchange of fire took place between a joint team of Special Task Force (STF), state's District Reserve Group (DRG) and rebels when security forces were out on an anti-Naxal operation in Kistaram area," Inspector General of Police (anti-Naxal operations) Deepanshu Kabra said.


