CRISP Report Tackles Supply Chain Security



The Research Council of the ASIS Foundation announces the release of the latest addition to its series of Connecting Research in Security to Practice (CRISP) reports, "Situational Crime Prevention and Supply Chain Security." The report focuses on situational crime prevention in domestic and international supply chains. Its author, Harald Haelterman Ph.D., has created a reference guide on introducing a situational crime prevention program to a business environment.

Haelterman presents an approach in six consecutive stages, emphasizing the importance of addressing challenges early and focusing on the selection of alternative measures to mitigate identified risks. While the approach is illustrated in a transportation and logistics environment, it is equally applicable to other industries, the public sector, and to virtually any type of criminal or disruptive behavior.

Launched in 2008, CRISP reports provide practical, research-based solutions to help security professionals effectively tackle a range of security issues.

The ASIS Research Council invites experts in specialized aspects of security to present their views on a specific security concern. The reports provide concise summaries of available research, deliver expert analysis, and offer proven approaches and best practices, which readers can integrate into existing or planned programs.

CRISP reports are sister publications to those produced by Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS) of the U.S. Department of Justice. COPS reports, which can be accessed at www.cops.usdoj.gov, focus on policing, while CRISP reports focus on security.

ASIS/Wharton Program Changes Announced



The Security Executive Leadership Program is now leaner, stronger, and faster.

The Wharton School of the University of Pennsylvania and ASIS International have undertaken changes to the highly respected Wharton/ASIS Program in Security Executive Leadership. Starting in November, the program will be conducted in one week at the Wharton School in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, U.S.A. This compression in course length from nine days to six is aimed at

making it easier for prospective students to attend, while not affecting either the program's quality or the value of the Wharton/ASIS Certificate.

Since 2004, ASIS has offered the program to its members and other security professionals who are ready to advance to a higher level of management education and effectiveness. In the decade since, 241 students from 19 countries have attended. The purpose of the program is to take these executives beyond professional education in security, exposing them to the world of management concerns and decision-making at the highest levels. Attendees gain insights into how they may influence those decisions.

The program has historically been presented in two sessions-the first during one week in November, followed by another week in February. Now it will be consolidated into a single November session. To do this without sacrificing quality, significant steps have been taken which will make the program more focused and intense:

- Several courses will be eliminated as separate entities but their key content will be worked into other blocks of instruction.
- The program will increase the use of case studies to spur discussion and focus learning on key objectives. In developing the case studies, particular attention will be paid to situations faced by senior security executives and the input from senior security executives, especially alumni of the program, will be sought.
- More evening and weekend work will be required, and students will be housed at the Wharton School's Steinberg Conference Center to more fully immerse them in the program.

Students will benefit from the revised program in several ways: They will commit one week of their time instead of two. Perhaps most significant, however, is that the tuition will be greatly reduced.

While numerous chief security officers and their deputies have attended the program in the past, it is not limited to executives of any particular level. In fact, several corporations have made participation in the program a part of their suggested career track for security managers.

More information about the revamped Wharton/ASIS Program in Security Executive Leadership will be available later this summer.

Asia Pacific Overview

Victoria Police Claims No Heightened Risk Despite Outdated Software

According to The Victoria Age, Victoria Police say that its IT systems are not vulnerable to security breaches, despite using an outdated software system no longer supported by Microsoft. It was revealed earlier this month that Victoria Police are still using Windows XP, while Microsoft stopped supplying software updates in April.

The Age reported that, "A police spokeswoman said Microsoft would support XP for the next six months while Windows 7 is introduced and there would be no 'heightened risk.' But [Microsoft's director of trustworthy computing, Tim Rains,] wrote on Microsoft's security blog last August that every update released by the company resulted in attackers 'reverse engineering' them to find vulnerabilities. If weaknesses are found, they are then exploited. 'Since a security update will never become available for Windows XP to address these vulnerabilities, Windows XP will essentially have a 'zero day' vulnerability forever,' Mr Rains wrote."

The Victoria Police are currently updating IT systems after assessing the needs of police. The agency was allocated \$23.3 million in last year's state budget. The overhauls may include access to real-time information in the field, possibly through the use of tablet devices, as are used by other police forces, according to The Age.

Australia Concerned About Returning Extremists

Australian news reports indicate that up to 300 young Australians may have travelled to the Middle East to join the forces of the Islamic State of Iraq and Syria (ISIS). Because of this, the Australian government has decided to tighten border security in an effort to detect these extremists returning from the Middle East combat zones.

Immigration Minister Scott Morrison stressed that more than 150 Australian combatants have been identified and that the cancellation of some passports have been initiated.

News.com.au reports that "Prime Minister Tony Abbott said Australians should not think the battle for Iraq was none of their business and revealed preparations had been made to ensure the safety of our nationals in Baghdad, including five embassy staff."

New Risks Created by Cloud and Mobile

Kevin Skapinetz, director of strategy, product marketing and alliances with IBM, states that a stronger technological and procedural defence is needed with organisations.

"What has changed in the last years, and has led to this rash of breaches, is the fact that it's no longer only someone who is curious and trying to impress somebody. It's now organised teams of people that wake up each day, grab a cup of coffee, and work with other people to achieve a common goal - which is to break into a specific targeted organization," he said during the IBM's Solutions Connect 2014 conference.

Intelligence, innovation and integration are more important than ever in developing complete security defences. Companies also need to find people with security skills who are able to handle these threats and can design a system coherent with the organization's policy.

Enhanced Security at Indian Missions in Afghanistan

As a result of the May 23 attack on the Indian Consulate in Herat, security measures at Indian missions in Afghanistan have been improved with the help of ITBP and Afghan security force.

During the attack, four men opened fire at the offices of the Consulate General of India (CGI). The four attackers were intercepted after 44 seconds and were all killed by both Indo-Tibetan Border Police (ITBP) personnel and Afghan security forces. ITBP already sent a squad of 80 trained commandos to the country for security measures.

The ITBP Director General Chief Subhas Goswami said the Indian Embassy in Kabul and four Consulates in Herat, Kandahar, Jalalabad, and Mazar-e-Sharif have been brought under heightened security measures.
