Bergouignan Named Woman of the Year



For the last ten years, the Trophées de la Sécurité have celebrated the achievements of leading French security professionals. This year, for the first time, they have honoured a Woman of the Year.

Stéphanie Bergouignan, CPP, ASIS Women in Security (WIS) Group leader for ASIS Region 9, won the inaugural award. The jury based the decision on projects developed during her career, as well as her forward vision, operational excellence, and promotion of the profession.

Bergouignan, who holds an executive MBA from the French business school HEC, is one only a small number of women leaders of private security companies. She began her career in the City of London before guiding her security company to the forefront of the French industry through a strategic repositioning at the high-end of the market.

Directly in charge of the operational and commercial departments of this 500-guard family holding, she contributes to the profession in parallel to her professional activities. Today, she is one of eight Certified Protection Professionals® (CPPs) in France.

A lecturer at University Paris Descartes, Bergouignan is also a regular speaker at seminars on the theme of creating and capturing value in low-tech industries.

The jury that selected Bergouignan included some of the most well-known CSOs in France, such as P. Espagnol CSO of EDF; Y. Prod'homme CSO of Alcatel; A. Juillet, head of CDSE; and O. Feray, president of Prosegur in France.

During the awards event, Stéphanie had the opportunity to promote ASIS and WIS to an audience of more than 500 security professionals.

As the ASIS European leader for the WIS network, she sees her mission as "unlocking reluctance."

In Europe, WIS aims to:

- Promote the security industry to women as a professional career path.
- Highlight female security experts to the media, conference organisers, public authorities, and others.
- Finance internationally recognised certifications and training.



Ireland Chapter Seminar

The recent Ireland Chapter Seminar was hosted by Google at its European headquarters in Dublin. The seminar was attended by more than 50 members and invited guests, who heard some thought-provoking presentations on the Criminal Assets Bureau and data centre security. They also had the opportunity to participate in a lively panel discussion on travel security.

Detective inspector Brian Woods of An Garda Síochána gave an excellent overview of Ireland's Criminal Assets Bureau which was established in 1996 to carry out investigations into the suspected proceeds of criminal conduct. Brian explained that the Criminal Assets Bureau uses a multiagency, multidisciplinary partnership approach in its investigations into the suspected proceeds of criminal conduct. It works closely with international crime investigation agencies, and has successfully targeted proceeds of foreign criminality from countries such as the United States and the United Kingdom.

The travel security panel discussion was preceded by an excellent presentation by Google Regional Security Manager Sam Roper, during which a number of important discussion points regarding travel security programmes were raised. These included the business risk appetite versus business needs, location, traveller profiling, and testing crisis response plans. Sam was joined on the panel by John McNichols, RSO. of the U.S. Embassy in Dublin, and consultant Joe Cully. This interactive session was chaired by Brendan Reynolds, Google security manager, who impressed upon attendees the key message of keeping travel safe and low-risk.

The final presentation on the topic of "Security Design Considerations for Data Centres" was presented by Narinder Dio of Cornerstone. Dio provided an overview of the new European Standard for Data Centre Facilities and Infrastructures (EN 50600), environmental design considerations, and security control room design and operational considerations.

The meeting was closed by the Ireland Chapter Chair John Bailey who thanked the speakers, attendees, and Google for hosting the event.

Revised CPP Exam to Begin in February

The Certified Protection Professional® (CPP) exam domains have been revised based on the completion of a 2014 job analysis. This important analysis is undertaken for all of the ASIS certification programs approximately every five years. It is an essential process, as it helps to ensure the exam content remains current and accurately reflects job-related activities, competencies, and professional standards. These changes will take effect in February.

EU Overview

Europe's Terror Weak Spot

Belgium has a local terrorism problem. Deputy Prime Minister Jan Jambon, who also serves as the interior minister in the Belgian government, said that 400 people have left the country to join ISIL to date, with a clear majority of Belgian recruits coming from Brussels.

He said the country had gotten a better grip on extremism in most Belgian cities, but said the exception was Brussels. The country's capital is "too divided" between national and regional authorities, he said, complicating the counterterrorism efforts here.

"Brussels is a relatively small city, 1.2 million," Jambon said. "And yet we have six police departments. Nineteen different municipalities. New York is a city of 11 million. How many police departments do they have? One."

U.S. and U.K. to Hold Joint Financial Cybersecurity Exercise

The U.S. and British governments will hold a joint exercise to test cybersecurity and information-sharing arrangements involving global financial institutions, according to the U.K. National Computer Emergency Response Team.

The initiative will not be a "war game" involving live testing and will instead check communication and coordination links between governments, authorities, and companies, an e-mailed statement read. While it will involve financial firms, it will not test their individual responses, it said.

European Parliament Calls for Drone Legislation



The European Parliament has called on the executive to table legislation ensuring the safe use of drones in civil aviation, hoping to boost an industry expected to reach €80 billion by 2025.

The European Commission is preparing a legislative proposal by the end of 2015, which will develop rules for the safe integration of civil drones into European airspace.

In a [resolution](#) adopted on 29 October, the Parliament urged the commission to take a risk-based approach, without creating unnecessary red-tape for the industry, said Jacqueline Foster, a British Conservative MEP who steered the resolution through Parliament.

National rules on the safe use of nonmilitary drones exist in a number of countries but there is currently no EU-wide regulation. This hampers the development of an EU-wide market for drones which is forecast to reach 80 billion by 2025, MEPs said.

Germany Vulnerable to Money Laundering

Germany's secretive financial sector is second only to Luxembourg in its vulnerability to money laundering, and is one of the worst member states for tax dodging, according to an analysis of EU nations published a year after the Luxleaks scandal.

Most of the 15 countries scrutinised were failing to tackle tax evasion and avoidance, the report coordinated by the European Network on Debt and Development (Eurodad) said, with "ample opportunities" for multinationals and wealthy individuals to hide money.

"Some of the most troubling countries are still Luxembourg and Germany, which offer a diverse set of options for concealing ownership and laundering money," the network of 48 NGOs, including Oxfam and Christian Aid, said.

EU Sharpens Tone on Need for Safe Harbour Agreement Replacement

In October, the European Commission indicated that the United States would have until January 2016 to define a new set of guidelines for the transfer of data in and out of EU member states following the invalidation of the Safe Harbour agreement. On Nov. 6, the EU released a new memo offering U.S. organizations guidance in their privacy obligations and making it clear that they expect the majority of the work to define a new framework to come from the United States.

Previously providing a holistic framework for U.S.-based organizations to exchange data across European Union borders, the Safe Harbour agreement was struck down in October following a ruling by the European Court of Justice. Despite ongoing discussions about a replacement framework for Safe Harbour, during an address on the topic from Brussels last week, EU leaders suggested that the U.S. will need to spearhead initiatives that support those newer frameworks.
