

On 15 and 16 September, the ASIS International Switzerland Chapter held two successful workshops on Safe, Secure and Resilient Smart Cities attended by a large audience of both members and nonmembers. These events, hosted by Novartis in Basel and by Richemont in Geneva, were the highlight of this year's chapter educational program.

The attendees first listened to short introductions by Swiss and other experts on the four central themes:

- The relevance of safety and security for Smart Cities
- Business continuity and crisis management
- Public-private partnership
- Critical infrastructure protection

After the introduction, Dino Auciello, journalist at weekly economic magazine *Bilan*, moderated questions from the audience. The participants then joined dedicated groups, which each worked on the salient issues of one of the central themes. Finally, the whole audience listened to a short presentation by each group.

The results of the workshop will be an integral part of the white paper being prepared by the Switzerland Chapter's working party on safe, secure, and resilient Smart Cities. This white paper is directed at planners in Switzerland to sharpen their understanding of the specific safety and security aspects when they design Smart City projects. After the event, the chapter received a good deal of positive feedback.

The next meeting of the chapter will be its General Assembly on November 12.

On 17 September, members of the ASIS International Austrian Chapter met at Sber-Bank in Vienna. The meeting was attended by 12 members and two guests.

After a warm welcome from the host and chapter member Erik Marangoni, I gave updates on a range of ASIS news, events, and educational and council activities, including coverage of the Austrian Chapter's visit to the airport in Bratislava in both *ASIS EuroDynamics* and *ASIS Dynamics*.

Chapter Member Bernhard Maier reported on his attendance of the recent German Chapter meeting in Potsdam, Germany, and the interest in closer connections between the chapters.

Sebastien Puchner spoke on his exploration of collaboration with educational institutions, which he has tentatively titled "Practice Meets Science." He hopes the project will launch before the end of the year.

After these updates, Erik Marangoni spoke on "Data Protection and Security," using examples from his experience in the banking sector during the last decade. He sees a shift from physical security into cybersecurity as well as an increased involvement with operational risk management. It is necessary to increase the awareness of staff about the legal aspects of data protection as well as the risk of noncompliance, he said. Cunning social engineering is on the rise too. Maragoni's closing message was, "Information is the new asset but privacy is the new weapon."

The next Austria Chapter meeting will be 19 November, followed by the Christmas meeting at the Criminal Museum.

The 2015 *Internet Organised Crime Threat Assessment (IOCTA)*, the annual presentation of the cybercrime threat landscape by Europol's European Cybercrime Centre (EC3), covers the key developments, changes and emerging threats in the field of cybercrime for the period under consideration.

It offers a view predominantly from a law enforcement perspective, highlighting a number of operational successes, and is based on contributions by EU Member States and the expert input of Europol staff, which has been further enhanced and combined with input from private industry, the financial sector and academia.

EU Court Invalidates Data Transfer Pact

Judges of the European Court of Justice (ECJ) in Luxembourg on 6 October delivered a blow against a 15-year-old European Union/United States data transfer pact, EU Observer reports.

The ECJ rejected the so-called Safe Harbour agreement and declared it invalid. Privacy campaigner Max Schrems, whose complaint against Facebook Ireland initiated the case, said the judgment "clarifies that mass surveillance violates our fundamental rights." He said the judgement makes it "clear that US businesses cannot simply aid US espionage efforts in violation of European fundamental rights."

The EU judges said Ireland's court must now decide whether to suspend the transfer of data from Facebook to the United States. The verdict also affects some 4,400 US firms that have signed up to the self-certification agreement. Safe Harbour is supposed to provide an "adequate" level of protection whenever data from EU citizens is transferred to the U.S.

The European Commission on 6 October said the transfer of data between the EU and U.S. will continue.

EU Rail Security: Will the Member States Take the Plunge?

Until the jihadist attempt on 21 August to slaughter passengers on a high-speed train travelling from Brussels to Paris, the security aspects of intercity rail have largely flown -- by design -- below the radar of law-makers across Europe.

The one exception has been Spain, whose Madrid station attack in 2004 led to passenger scanning equipment for the sector. As one EU transport policy official put it a few days after the foiled August attack, "cargo theft, vandalism, cybersecurity, and graffiti: these have been the priorities for Europe's rail sector. Security was never flagged as important."

"There is very little common approach to land transport security anywhere in Europe," Security Europe writes.
