Balancing Security and Work Flexibility at the ASIS Benelux Congress

Around 200 security professionals attended the 16th edition of the ASIS Benelux Security Management Congress, held in Utrecht, The Netherlands, on 8 June 2017. The congress was organised by Vakmedianet and the ASIS International Benelux Chapter and zoomed in on the security challenges of 'The New Ways of Working'.

The new ways of working aim to reduce cost and boost flexibility and retention by removing strict office-bound 9-to-5 work constraints and constant management oversight. Security managers share the enthusiasm for smarter and more efficient work methods, but are confronted with questions such as:

- How do I stay in control if numerous flexible workers are granted access to the workplace 24/7?
- How do I control the flow of information that travels in and out of our organisation (and often across the globe)?
- How can I effectively promote a security and safety culture in an unconfined workforce?
- What technical, facility and organisational challenges will still be coming my way?

Conference Chairman Brenno de Winter, opened the conference and reflected on the influence of digital developments on our personal and professional lives.

Martin Vliem, Microsoft's national security officer in the Netherlands, picked up from there and spoke of the digital transformation that has made the new ways of working possible. He also pointed out the cyber risks that come with this and the solutions that can be deployed to mitigate risks.

Hylco Nijp, lecturer in human resource management at the HAN University of Applied Sciences, the Netherlands, shared his research on the labour-related psychological aspects of new ways of working. Nijp stressed the importance of autonomy in coping with work pressure and preventing burn-out. Nijp also pointed out that job autonomy has a positive effect on countering counterproductive behaviours such as sabotage, fraud and theft.

In addition to plenary presentations, a dozen educational sessions and workshops were held in smaller settings. Sponsors generously donated their time, know-how and funds. Attendees met solution providers at the information market and networked in a great atmosphere.







EU Overview

2017 EU Terrorism Report Released



In 2016, a total of 142 failed, foiled, and completed attacks were reported by eight EU Member States. More than half (76) of them were reported by the United Kingdom. France reported 23 attacks, Italy 17, Spain 10, Greece 6, Germany 5, Belgium 4, and the Netherlands 1 attack. 142 victims died in terrorist attacks, and 379 were injured in the EU. Although a large number of terrorist attacks were not connected with jihadism, the latter accounts for the most serious forms of terrorist activity as nearly all reported fatalities and most of the casualties were the result of jihadist terrorist attacks.

Czech Law to Allow Civilians to Shoot During Terrorist Attacks

The Czech parliament passed a constitutional amendment on 28 June that challenges EU gun control rules by allowing legal firearms holders to use them when national security is threatened, including during terrorist attacks. "We don't want to disarm our citizens at a time when the security situation in Europe is getting worse," Interior Minister Milan Chovanec told parliament.

The amendment, which passed by a large majority, is expected easily to gain approval from the senate and President Milos Zeman, still needed for it to take effect.

Europol - EUIPO 2017 Situation Report on Counterfeiting and Piracy in the EU

The latest situation report into counterfeiting in Europe, prepared by Europol and the European Union Intellectual Property Office (EUIPO) has been released. This report was presented at the IP Enforcement Summit in Berlin, an event organised by the German Federal Ministry of Justice and Consumer Protection, EUIPO and the European Commission. This report establishes that organised criminal groups are involved in intellectual property rights (IPR) crime. It also finds that EU-based criminal gangs involved in distributing counterfeit goods rely predominantly on manufacturers based abroad, but then organise importation, transportation, storage, and distribution of the counterfeit goods within the EU. The majority of counterfeit goods come from China: the development of the Silk Road and the corresponding increasing use of rail and maritime transport between China and the EU support new threats in the IPR crime landscape.

ECB to Ask Banks to Report All Major Cyber Incidents




The European Central Bank will require banks it supervises to report all major cyber incidents starting this summer as it increases its focus on IT security, ECB board member Sabine Lautenschlaeger said on Monday. "We conducted a successful pilot phase in 2016. And now we will implement a long-term solution for all those banks that we directly supervise," Lautenschlaeger said.

EU Pressures Firms to Tackle Online Terrorism



EU leaders opened the door to cracking encryption of digital services like Whatsapp as a counterterrorism measure, according to a text they adopted at a summit in Brussels on 22 June. A last-minute change to the text, however, also mentioned privacy. The state and government leaders said that "challenges posed by systems that allow terrorists to communicate in ways that competent authorities cannot access, including end-to-end encryption" should be addressed.
