ASIS Council Members Present at the 2017 Euro CACS Conference





Preining introduced the audience to the new ASIS ANSI Standard, "Organisational Resilience in Organisations and their Supply Chain", explaining the proactive approach of the standard to enhance sustainability, survivability, and resilience for supporting the process of prevention, protection, preparedness, readiness, mitigation, response, continuity, and recovery from undesirable and disruptive events.

Ong subsequently navigated the present state of cybersecurity, the threat horizon until 2019, and the Society's way forward with key takeaways for the audience.

The presenters emphasised the importance of the new standard within globalised enterprises with an absolute dependency on IT and the necessity of a strong crisis management and business security plan to stay resilient.

A busy spring season is coming to an end for the ASIS Switzerland chapter. As reported in the April edition of EuroDynamics, nearly 100 people attended an event on travel security in Geneva. This was followed on 7 May by a breakfast networking event in Zürich on the theme of cybersecurity for travellers with short presentations by Michael Wandel from Control Risks and Aurore Chatard from International SOS. Attendees had the chance to ask questions and to share knowledge on the challenges of travelling with electronic devices, which often contain large amounts of sometimes sensitive data. Also highlighted was a reminder about the ever-growing interest and inventiveness of industrial spies seeking proprietary information.



Physical Security: 150 Things You Should Know, 2nd ed., Lawrence Fennelly and Marianna Perry, CPP; published by Butterworth Heinemann, 2016.

The ASIS Book Award Committee, comprised of ASIS members who are established authors, editors, and reviewers, examined security books published in 2016 by ASIS members. The nominated titles are reviewed, using thirteen criteria. The committee votes anonymously and confidentially by electronic ballot.

Almost two dozen titles were eligible for this year's award, which is in its fourth consecutive year. This award was inaugurated in 2014 by the IRC and the ASIS Crime Prevention Council to recognize published writers among ASIS membership and their contributions to the profession as well as to the publishing field.

The winner of the 2017 Security Book of the Year will be announced in July 2017. The book award will be presented at the 63rd Annual ASIS Seminar and Exhibits in Dallas, Texas, on Monday morning September 25th, in the Seminar Bookstore. Seminar attendees are invited to this Bookstore event, where the winning author(s) will be available to sign copies of their book.

WannaCry Provided First Test of EU Cyberattack Coordination



The European Union was able for the first time to present a coordinated cyberattack response when it faced the recent WannaCry ransomware hack, the head of the bloc's network security agency told Bloomberg BNA. The scope of the attack, which ultimately affected more than 300,000 computers in some 153 countries, provided a real test of new systems put in place under an EU cybersecurity law, European Union Agency for Network and Information Security (ENISA) Executive Director Udo Helmbrecht said.

On 22 May, the "European Investigation Order" entered into force. It simplifies the work of judicial authorities when they request evidence located in another EU country. For instance, if French judicial authorities are tracking terrorists hidden in Belgium, they can ask their Belgian counterparts to interrogate witnesses or conduct house searches on their behalf. This new tool will simplify and speed up cross-border criminal investigations.

Věra Jourová, Commissioner for Justice, Consumers and Gender Equality said: "Criminals and terrorists know no borders. Equipping judicial authorities with the European Investigation Order will help them cooperate effectively to fight organised crime, terrorism, drug trafficking and corruption. It will give judicial authorities access to evidence quickly wherever it is in the EU. I call on all Member States to implement it as quickly as possible to improve our common fight against crime and terrorism. In June we will also discuss with Member States solutions to facilitate the collection and exchange of e-evidence. It is time to fully modernise the tools available to judicial authorities to conduct investigations." The European Investigation Order is based on mutual recognition, which means that each EU country is obliged to recognise and carry out the request of the other country, as it would do with a decision coming from its own authorities.

Industry Should Take Lead on TT&A Governance



Last year, the European Commission reported that more than 40 million products suspected of violating an intellectual property right, with a total value of nearly €650m, were detained at the EU's external borders. The same report mentioned above also acknowledged a 15% rise in goods intercepted by Customs compared to the previous year. Accordingly, the European Union has brought forward legislation to tackle the issue in two of the sectors most affected, pharmaceuticals and tobacco. Tracking, tracing, and authentication (TT&A) has a big role to play in this. But who should be tasked with implementing and monitoring it?

US Tells EU: No Laptop Ban for Now



The U.S. has opted not to introduce a ban on bringing laptops into the cabins of flights to the United States from Europe, European sources told *POLITICO* - although the Trump administration said later that such a move "is still on the table." "No ban," a European Commission official said. "Both sides have agreed to intensify technical talks and try to find a common solution." After weeks of back and forth negotiations and panicked responses from airlines, this matter is closed, for now. However, the decision not to impose the ban could change based on future intelligence.

Evaluation and Revision of the Regulation on Marketing and Use of Explosives Precursors



Explosives precursors are chemical substances which can be misused to manufacture homemade explosives. Regulation (EU) No 98/2013 on the marketing and use of explosives precursors (the Regulation) introduced restrictions and controls on a limited number of chemicals that are listed in its two annexes. Despite the restrictions and controls introduced under the Regulation, regulated explosives precursor substances and mixtures continue to be accessed by individuals and groups that aim to carry out terrorist attacks in Europe. The use of regulated explosives precursors for terrorist purposes in Europe raises the question of whether the Regulation is effective in limiting availability to the general public of explosives precursor substances and ensuring the appropriate reporting of suspicious transactions through the supply chain.
