UK Chapter Young Professionals Event Launched at Aon Centre



Austria Chapter Meeting Focuses on Drones

The ASIS International Austria Chapter held its second meeting of the year on 20 April. Fourteen members and five guests, including local security students, attended the meeting which was hosted by chapter member Johann Laub at the Securitas premises.

The highlight of the evening was a presentation on "Fire and safety drones - modern tools in incident command systems". The successful implementation of drones in a large industrial park in Bitterfeld, Germany, was presented as a case study.

There, the drones can operate in environmental conditions between -10°C and $+40^{\circ}\text{C}$ and withstand wind-forces up to 18 m/s. The drones have multiple sensors on board and the equipment is modular and interchangeable. The equipment does not only detect gas leakages and fires but can also provide a damage assessment before sending

EU Overview

UK Intelligence Asks for 'Real Time' Data from Telecoms



A draft proposal of the British government shows the U.K. security services would be granted the power to surveil citizens in "near real time." The paper, leaked to digital activists at Open Rights Group but not confirmed by the U.K. Home Office, explains how telecoms and postal services would have to assist security services in intercepting electronic communications. The paper also mentions that telecoms companies should provide data "in an intelligible form" without "electronic protection," which would undermine encryption technologies used to protect user data, including personal data, that is gathered and stored by these companies.

Ansip Promises EU Rules on Data Flows by Autumn



The European Commission will propose legislation later this year to get rid of national restrictions that prevent data from moving between EU countries, following calls from more than a dozen member states to crack down. Andrus Ansip, the EU's technology policy chief, has been pushing for legislation guaranteeing the "free flow of data" for months. In January, he published a non-binding communication paper outlining some of the Commission's concerns but legal advisers were not convinced there should be a new law outlining how companies can move data across the bloc.

The National Security Agency in Washington picked up the signs. So did Emmanuel Macron's bare-bones technology team. And mindful of what happened in the American presidential campaign, the team created dozens of false email accounts, complete with phony documents, to confuse the attackers. The Russians, for their part, were rushed and a bit sloppy, leaving a trail of evidence that was not enough to prove for certain they were working for the government of President Vladimir V. Putin but which strongly suggested they were part of his broader "information warfare" campaign.
