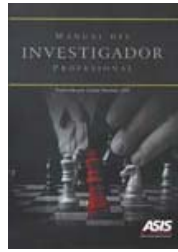

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Gerry Coller of Mitigate provided excellent insights into the world of technical surveillance countermeasures (TSCM) during his presentation. Coller, a retired law enforcement specialist in this area, demonstrated a variety of surveillance devices and their uses. He also highlighted the need for TSCM operatives to continuously train to stay current as technology continues to move forward at an alarming rate.



The final presentation was by Michael Murphy, CEO at SI-TARMS Ltd., which focussed on the evolution of Irish state security. Murphy provided details of the current geopolitical landscape and the challenges it offers Ireland. He also said that there is no formal threat level system for Ireland and no national threat assessment centre.

Madrid played host to the 6th Director of Security Summit. This event has been organised since 2005 by three Spanish associations for directors of security, including ASIS International's Spain Chapter, and in collaboration with the security magazine *Seguritecnia*. The programme comprised several presentations and roundtables, with ASIS members delivering three: Alberto Ray from Venezuela, regional vice president (RVP) of ASIS Region 8C, talked about "Positive Security;" Jose Luis Bolanos, CPP, CSO of Gas Natural and 1996-1998 Spain Chapter chair, explored "Why convergence cannot be stopped;" and Juan Muñoz, CPP, chair of ASIS Spain and assistant RVP of Region 9C, spoke about "Operational Resilience and its Relation with Corporate Security."

The other main presentation was "When Security Became Cybersecurity," delivered by Ramses Gallego, security strategist and evangelist from Symantec. The programme also incorporated an interesting block of presentations about critical infrastructure protection.

The event, held in the Mutua Forum, was attended by more than 300 professionals, including more than 40 ASIS members -- most of them directors of security. The summit was opened by Chief Police Commander Esteban Gandara, head of Spain's National Police Private Security Central Unit, and closed by Colonel Andres Sanz, commanding officer of SEPROSE, Spain's Guardia Civil Security and Protection Service.

Book Review: *Cyber Security: An Introduction for Non-Technical Managers*

An impressive compilation of methods that cybercriminals use to seize priceless information and finances from corporations and individuals appears in *Cyber Security: An Introduction for Non-Technical Managers*. Author Jeremy Swinfen Green provides practical and sound advice on how to minimize the risk and damage of these malicious attacks.

Aimed squarely at nontechnical managers from any profession, the book contains an excellent list of topics that should be addressed with IT departments. The author suggests dozens of different ways to protect against detrimental attacks that can occur through any device that is either stolen or has Internet capability. Twenty chapters grouped into three major sections span subjects such as protecting classified and private information on all devices, techniques to use while traveling, how to respond to a breach incident, and a great deal more.

The material is presented in an easy-to-read manner. Case studies appear every few pages and bring all the information into perspective in a way that is both useful and enjoyable. This book would be a desirable addition to the libraries of managers both in and outside of the security industry.

EU Overview

Swiss Endorse New Surveillance Powers



Swiss voters have given a strong approval to a law on new surveillance powers for the intelligence agencies. The new law would allow the authorities to tap phones, snoop on email and deploy hidden cameras and bugs. It would help Switzerland catch up with other countries, supporters say. Opponents have feared it could erode civil liberties and put Swiss neutrality at risk by requiring closer cooperation with foreign intelligence agencies. Some 65.5 percent of voters agreed to accept the proposal. It will allow the Federal Intelligence Service and other agencies to put suspects under electronic surveillance if authorised by a court, the defence ministry and the cabinet.

Aviation Regulatory Groups Tackle Drones

The European Aviation Safety Agency (EASA) and other aviation communities are trying to come up with a suitable set of rules and regulations for the safe operation across the EU of unmanned aerial vehicles (UAVs), otherwise known as drones. For example, EASA released its "Prototype Commission Regulation on Unmanned Aircraft Operations" on 22 August, followed by a similar document circulated on 31 August by the Joint Authorities for Rulemaking on Unmanned Systems, a global group of national aviation authority experts in which Europe has a leading role.

Europol Warns of Android Tap-and-Go Thefts



Law authorities have warned they believe criminals are using Android phones to trigger fraudulent tap-and-go payments. The alert comes in Europol's annual *Internet Organised Crime Threat Assessment* report. Experts had previously said that the rollout of smart wallet systems could raise such a threat. However, the police are unsure exactly how the attacks are being carried out and how common they are. "The possibility of compromising NFC [near field communication] transactions was explored by academia years ago, and it appears that fraudsters have finally made progress in the area," the report says.

EU Unveils Draft Law to Harmonise Scanner Certification

After several years of two-steps-forward/one-step-backward effort, the European Commission finally unveiled on 7 September its draft regulation to harmonise certification schemes for aviation security screening equipment across the EU member states. It hems in the ways that national authorities have traditionally tweaked their rules to protect their home market, thus forcing foreign suppliers of the equipment to get separation certifications in each country. Once approved, the new measure would put in place a common set of certification.

WhatsApp's Data-Gathering Probed



A German privacy watchdog has ordered Facebook to stop the intrusive collection of data from users of its WhatsApp messaging service. Hamburg's data protection commissioner Johannes Caspar issued an administrative order on 26 September prohibiting Facebook "with immediate effect" from collecting and storing data of German WhatsApp users -- roughly 35 million people. "It has to be their decision, whether they want to connect their account with Facebook," Caspar said in a statement.

Carmakers Fear EU Plans to Ease Data Flows Will Help Tech Rivals



European car manufacturers are seeking full control over the data sent to them by "connected vehicles" they put on the road, and fear a move by Brussels that would impose sharing that data with rivals. Connected cars are still just a catchphrase. Even if it's caught on in Brussels, manufacturers are only just getting started putting out cars with internet functions. But they are already nervous that the European Commission's plans to clamp down on how they use data from vehicles will put a damper on what they will earn off the new technology.
