ASIS/ASW Global Security Forum Held in Berlin

As economies go global, so do criminal organizations and corporate security departments and law enforcement agencies must form alliances and cooperate to stay ahead. This was the theme of an ASIS International and German Alliance for Security in the Economy (ASW) full-day conference on 26 November in Berlin. The event gathered 50 senior professionals in corporate security and law enforcement from 11 countries. Volker Wagner, president of ASW and chair of the ASIS European Convergence and ESRM Subcommittee served as the event's chair.

The programme started with a keynote presentation on cybersecurity from Andreas Könen, vice president of the German Federal Office for Information Security. According to Könen, cyberespionage is typically detected only after about 240 days have passed. He added that the amount of spam is decreasing, but malware in spam is increasing. Currently, 275,000,000 types of malware are affecting Windows. Software continues to be the weakest link, and on average, two new vulnerabilities are pinpointed each day, he said.

Könen was followed by Sabine Wiedemann, head of corporate security at Daimler AG, who spoke about security operations at the global company. Wiedemann noted that security cannot operate without interbusiness partners such as the legal and human resource departments.

Next on the agenda was a panel discussion with Gerhard Hantschke, head of international strategic development at the German Federal Criminal Police; Frank Ewald, vice president of corporate security at Deutsche Post DHL; and Stuart Hughes, CPP, global director of profit protection at Adidas. The discussion focused on public-private cooperation. While it was noted that good cooperation exists between the private sector and law enforcement in Germany, it can be much enhanced. Project Griffin in London was named as a successful example of this kind of superlative cooperation. However, in Germany, privacy legislation places strong limits on the depth information exchanged between the public and private entities.

The panel discussion was followed by an excellent presentation by Dr. Christoph Rojahn of Deloitte & Touche, GmbH, about trends and recent developments in international forensics. Rojahn noted that compliance should be a key driver of corporate security. Overlapping regulations are increasingly problematic for the private sector and during the next decade, we will see a further increase in legal complexity, Rojahn told attendees.



EU Overview

Drone and Privacy Intrusion



Businesses using drones to capture images have brought a new range of conflicts with the risk of what is being termed "collateral intrusion" of the privacy of individuals. In the United Kingdom, Parliament began to question the use of drones for commercial purposes, as these aerial vehicles, in the course of operations, could capture images of individuals that contravene the Data Protection Act. However, data protection boundaries remain blurry when it comes to the use of drones by private individuals.

The scope of European Union data protection rules covers the collection, processing, and retention of personal data, but does not apply where personal data is collected for private purposes. The scope of private use must be clarified by legislation.

The European Commission launched a consultation last August on a policy initiative on drones. The commission is preparing a summary report that will be available in the near future

The current European Union legislation framework regarding EU data protection is an attempt to update the outdated. The directive currently in use is from 1995, and at the time of its implementation, did not anticipate that the Internet would become such a paramount resource. A single law is needed by legislators to simplify the current legislative patchwork and reduce the administrative burden associated with compliance in multiple jurisdictions, leading to a projected savings for businesses of around €2.3 billion per year. The initiative will reinforce consumer confidence in online services and providing a much-needed boost to growth, jobs, and innovation in Europe.

Among the key highlights of the proposal is the so-called "right to be forgotten," the right of data portability, and the implementation of a single national data-protection authority.

The legislative process to update the directive began in 2012 upon European Commission Vice President and EU Justice Commissioner Viviane Redding's initiative. However, the process has been time consuming and still requires further discussion.

Fighting Piracy Off the Somali Coast



The European Union Institute for Security Studies published a report on the fight against piracy off the coast of Somalia. This report summarizes the lessons learned by the Contact Group on Piracy off the Coast of Somalia (CGPCS) and provides an in-depth analysis from the field.

The report was written to address key challenges and circulate the experiences of those involved in the fight against piracy. In its conclusions, the report analyses the international framework and to what extent the work of the contact group can be applied to various policy fields such as peacebuilding bodies. This task is not easy and requests a sound analysis of the state of play to result in effective preventative and defensive actions.

This report details the work of the CGPCS since its implementation in 2009.

Thriving Business on the Anonymous Internet



Dozens of Dark Web "retailers" are proving resilient, despite the efforts of law enforcement. Moreover, the anonymous Internet is expanding and becoming more sophisticated. This dark market is dominated by two upstarts, Agora and Evolution. The most popular products on these sites are illegal and prescription drugs. Other high-traffic sections are weapons and "tutorials" on how to commit various crimes.

The dark net has actually transformed the illegal wholesale market: it is less dangerous than street trades, it reduces territorialism, and the product quality is higher due to the customer rating system. Jamie Bartlett, author of *The Dark Net*, warns that these sites are impossible to close because "listings, messaging, payment, and feedback are all separated, controlled by no central party."

Joint Operation Takes Down More than 400 Dark Sites

An online raid jointly conducted by 16 European countries and the United States took down Silk Road 2.0 and 400 other sites that sold illegal items such as drugs and weapons. These dark sites operated on the anonymous Tor network that allows accessing the hard-to-reach parts of the Internet where illegal marketplaces thrive.

Many thought that these marketplaces were completely untouchable, but now the authorities say that they have developed new techniques to take these networks down. The people behind them, however, remain hard to catch -- only 17 arrests were made. Considering that the Dark Web is estimated to be up to 500 times the size of the regular Web, it becomes clear that there is much work to be done.

Hotel Wi-Fi Connection Spy Attacks

Since 2007, multiple hotel Wi-Fi connections in Asia, and some in America, have been hijacked by a group dubbed DarkHotel. The victims seem to be deliberately targeted; they have been mostly people from India, Japan, and North Korea -- all countries that either have nuclear weapons already or could easily build them. Other victims of the malware include senior bosses from American weapons firms.

Presumably, DarkHotel's actions are the work of a nation-state, due to their highly technical execution. Clues in the disassembled malware have led some to suspect the South Korean government.

Would-be Jihadists Cruising to War Zones



The past three months, an unknown number of potential jihadists have travelled on cruise ships to reach conflict areas in the Middle East such as Iraq, Syria, and Turkey, according to Interpol. The police agency said that more stringent checks of passenger lists should be made by airlines and cruise operators to keep the situation from escalating.

"There is evidence that the individuals, especially in Europe, are travelling mostly to the Turkish coastal town of Izmit and other places to engage in this type of activity," said Interpol Director of Counterterrorism Pierre St. Hilaire.

Europol Coordinated Airport Ticket Fraud Raids

Europol organised raids in 80 airports in 45 countries to detect travellers that were using a fraudulently bought ticket. In total 118 people who bought tickets with stolen credit cards were arrested. The initiative is called Global Airport Action and is a joint effort between police forces, airlines and credit card companies. The airlines lose more than U.S. \$1 billion a year and with this action a first step is taken against organised crime.

Belgacom and EU Cyberattack May be Linked to U.S. and British Intelligence

According to a technical research conducted by the investigative news Web site The Intercept, the complex malware Regin is the technology behind the cyberattacks against the European Union and a Belgian telecommunications company called Belgacom. The analysis also verified that these were carried out by U.S. and British intelligence agencies.

The hacking operations on the European Union and Belgacom were discovered after Edward Snowden leaked U.S. National Security Agency documents.
