

Security Experts Wanted for HORIZON 2020



In the area of research and innovation (R&I), the European Commission has created an initiative called Innovation Europe that aims to secure Europe's global competitiveness. The financial instrument of Innovation Europe is HORIZON 2020, the biggest EU R&I programme to date, which aims to create more breakthroughs, discoveries, and world-firsts by taking great ideas from the lab to the market.

HORIZON 2020 includes the programme Secure Societies - Protecting the Freedom and Security of Europe and its Citizens, with a budget for 2014-2020 of €1.7 billion. The stated aim of the Secure Societies programme is help implement the policy goals of the Europe 2020 strategy, the Security Industrial Policy, the Internal Security Strategy, and the Cybersecurity Strategy.

For this purpose, the specific work programme for the period 2014-2015 is divided into four calls:

Disaster resilience. Safeguarding and securing society, including adapting to climate change. The objective is to enhance the resilience of EU society against natural and man-made disasters, ranging from new crisis management tools to communication interoperability, and to develop novel solutions for the protection of critical infrastructure.

The fight against crime and terrorism. The objective is to fight crime and terrorism in an increased number of ways

Security Industry Survey of Risk and Professional Competencies

The ASIS Foundation and University of Phoenix have released the Security Industry Survey of Risks and Professional Competencies, a survey and research report that sheds light on the crucial talent and training needs of this high-growth industry. The survey was initiated to identify top enterprise security risks, to better understand the industry's talent needs, and to generate actionable recommendations for strengthening the industry's workforce.

When asked to rank the top security risks likely to affect enterprises in the next five years, security leaders identified cybersecurity (39 percent) as the top risk, followed by crime (33 percent), mobile technology (12 percent), natural disasters (9 percent) and globalization (7 percent). Security industry leaders ranked management issues and limited resources (53 percent), industry segmentation (21 percent), an aging workforce (13 percent) and lack of standardized education and certifications (13 percent) as the top challenges facing the security industry.

"Enterprise security is critical to economic growth and affects organizations of all sizes, from small businesses to multinational corporations," says Linda Florence, Ph.D., CPP, president, ASIS Foundation Board of Trustees. "The

complexities of enterprise security and rapid growth in the industry demand a strong talent pipeline and a commitment to ongoing talent development to address constant competency updates. ASIS collaborated with University of Phoenix on this research to help identify education needs that align with specific industry demands."

There are millions of jobs in security management and the industry is growing exponentially. The seven most critical competencies for security professionals identified by the University of Phoenix and ASIS survey include: decision making (92 percent), oral communication (91 percent), anticipatory thinking (87 percent), maximizing performance of others (86 percent), collaboration (84 percent), self-regulation (84 percent), and persuasive influencing (84 percent). The full list of 22 critical competencies can be found in the comprehensive report.

"Despite the increasing need for skilled security professionals, the industry is without a complete set of industry-endorsed competencies and skills that professionals will need to adequately respond to the emerging risks facing the global economy," states James Marks, executive dean of the University of Phoenix College of Criminal Justice and Security. "Relevant education and training aligned to industry requirements is crucial to protecting and growing the infrastructure of businesses in the United States and globally. University of Phoenix and the ASIS Foundation have joined together to research and promote the identified competencies that will be essential for tomorrow's security professionals."

Florence also emphasizes the significant career growth opportunities in the security industry for individuals with diverse backgrounds. "The security field offers rewarding careers with incredible growth potential," she says. "Security roles are evolving and security leaders are expected to also possess business management skills such as strategic planning, contingency planning, supply chain knowledge, STEM literacy, people management and financial planning. Aligning education and security industry needs can help attract highly skilled professionals to the field and provide security management professionals with rewarding career paths. The ASIS Foundation partnership with University of Phoenix enables the industry to support these workforce development priorities."

Survey Methodology. This national survey of 483 security leaders who are ASIS International members was conducted by University of Phoenix and the ASIS Foundation between September and October 2013. Respondents to the survey are members of the ASIS Foundation, currently working in the United States with a professional focus on general security management. Three quarters of respondents (75 percent) are responsible for managing or supervising security functions for their employers.

Both fulltime and part-time students pursuing an associate's, bachelor's, or master's degree at an accredited institution can participate. Graduate level winners receive \$1,500, and undergraduate winners receive \$1,000. Century.


- The most promising technologies to meet tomorrow's security challenge.

A three-person review committee affiliated with academic institutions, including a member of the ASIS Academic Programs Council, will judge the submissions. Judging criteria include the relevance of the content and the application of the analysis and the conclusions presented.

Security Metrics Research Report Released



A major metrics research report and security metrics tool was released this month by the ASIS Foundation, filling a crucial gap in the profession and providing security practitioners with powerful resources to measure and demonstrate the value of the security function. The full report is available as a free download. Printed copies may be purchased online through the ASIS Store and a Kindle version will be available in the near future.

"Persuading Senior Management with Effective, Evaluated Security Metrics" is the culmination of a multiyear research project funded by the ASIS Foundation following work done by the ASIS International Defense and Intelligence Council.

The main purpose of the project was to develop a tool that will help security professionals evaluate and improve their metrics and use them to demonstrate return on investment as well as alignment with organizational goals.

According to the report's executive summary, without compelling metrics, security professionals and their budgets are left to the intuition of company executives. "With metrics, the security function grounds itself on measurable results that correlate with investment, and the security professional can speak to leadership in a familiar business language," the report notes.

"This is ground-breaking research for the security profession," said Dr. Linda Florence, CPP, Ph.D., president of the ASIS Foundation Board of Trustees. "Finally, we have scientifically

based information and a validation method that are applicable to the entire field and makes a significant addition to the security body of knowledge."

The ASIS Foundation awarded a grant in spring 2013 to Global Skills X-change (GSX), partnered with Ohlhausen Research, to carry out the project. The research project produced a database of selected security metrics and guidelines for effective use of security metrics to inform and persuade senior management.

"This report outlines the limitations of previous attempts to guide the collation and use of metrics and presents a methodology for their integration into security practice today," said Professor Martin Gill, director of Perpetuity Research & Consultancy International and a member of the ASIS Foundation Research Council. "Those needing to find ways of showing how security can and does add value will find much to learn from this important study."

The research project and the new metrics tool will be reviewed at an education session, "Security Metrics: Leveraging Performance Measures to Gain Efficiencies and Demonstrate Return on Investment," on Tuesday, 30 September, as part of the ASIS 60th Annual Seminar and Exhibits at the Georgia World Congress Center in Atlanta.

Streamlining Recertification



Recently, the ASIS International Professional Certification Board (PCB) reviewed the recertification programme with the goal of streamlining the process and ensuring the benefits of professional development are widespread and reflect the needs of all security professionals. After careful consideration, the PCB decided to standardize the Continuing Professional Education (CPE) requirements for all designations.

The change will require all ASIS certification holders-CPPs, PCIs, and PSPs-to earn 60 CPEs every three years. The new policy will take effect on 1 January. A detailed guide on the change, available under the Certification tab on the ASIS Web site, www.asisonline.org, is available in both English and Spanish.

The quarterly Certification Headlines Newsletter and a series of FAQs on the changes are also available on the website.

In general, CPE credits can be earned in eight categories: membership, education, instructor, author, volunteer service

certification programme, public service, and other accomplishments. In this last category, for example, the PCB may consider special activities related to security or business management fields, as described in the domains of each examination, as eligible for credits. The PCB will determine whether any points will be awarded based on the scope of the activity and other relevant factors.

Overall, the change provides certified professionals with more opportunities and diversified options for their continuing education to be on par with their work experience. The standardization also eliminates the need for multiple designation holders to maintain different CPE guidelines for each certification.

New ASIS Standard Released

ASIS International has released a new standard to help organizations address operational risks in their supply chains, including risks to tangible and intangible assets. Supply Chain Risk Management: A Compilation of Best Practices Standard (SCRM) was developed by a global, cross-disciplinary technical team in partnership with the Supply Chain Security Council.

SCRM will serve as a practitioner's guide to SCRM and associated processes for the management of risks within the organization and its end-to-end supply chain. This guidance standard is a compilation of current best practices. It presents a generic approach to risk and resilience management that is applicable to all types of risk and all types of organizations. SCRM is vital for organizations that rely on extended operations, both internal and external, for their success. It involves the assessment and control of risk events at all points in an end-to-end supply chain, from sources of raw materials to end use by customers and consumers.

"Today, all organizations have critical dependencies and interdependencies. To build a resilient organization it is essential to understand the organization's supply chain and how risks within the organization and its supply chain impact the achievement of objectives," says Dr. Marc H. Siegel, commissioner of the ASIS Global Standards Initiative. "This is the first standard to provide practical guidance, based on the experiences of both large and small organizations, about managing risks in their supply chain to increase their resilience capacity and create value."

The SCRM standard will help practitioners anticipate, prevent, protect, mitigate, manage, respond, and recover from potentially undesirable and disruptive events, as well as identify opportunities. However, the best strategy for addressing risk events will be determined by the organization's context of operations, its risk appetite, and results of risk assessments. Adoption of this standard should build on rather than supplant existing specialized risk programmes.

EU Overview

Protecting the Integrity of Sport Competition

A report, "Protecting the Integrity of Sport Competition: The Last Bet for Modern Sport," jointly issued by The University of Paris, Sorbonne, and the International Centre for Sport Security (ICSS), is the result of a two-year research project.

The issuing institutions say it is the first-ever comprehensive report into the scale and scope of illegal activity related to sport. The Sorbonne-ICSS report provides an outline of the research concerning the manipulation of sports competitions and illegal bets and suggests effective prevention mechanisms. The report also promotes cooperation and coordination between stakeholding public and private entities on national and international levels.

Saudi Prince Ambushed and Robbed in Paris

A Saudi Prince was attacked by several gunmen while he was on his way through northern Paris to Le Bourget Airport. Although he was accompanied by a convoy of cars, approximately eight men with weapons stole €250,000 and documents from the Saudi embassy.
