ASIS International and IE Business School in Madrid have concluded the first edition of the Spanish version of the Effective Management for Security Professionals course -- Gestión Estratégica para Profesionales de Seguridad. Both programs and faculty are the same with the exception of the program director: Chris Walker heads the English version and Juan Muñoz, CPP, for the Spanish edition.


The Spanish-language course was attended by eight ASIS members from Brazil, Mexico and Spain, and the evaluation score they gave the program was a uniform five out of five. The program is four days long and focuses on four areas: operational finances, negotiation, strategy and organisational leadership.

In total, more than 70 ASIS members from fifteen countries have taken the course since its launch in 2010.



The *Travel Security Handbook* by Sven Leidel provides a concise overview of the manifold global travel security issues that security managers, supervisors, human relations managers, and business travelers must take into account. It provides guidance on a wide range of concerns, covering topics such as organizational planning; alert and notification services; employee preparation; in-house awareness campaigns; safe air and ground transport; legal issues; emergency resources; and more.

What makes this book stand out is that it addresses travel security from a European perspective. It is exceptionally helpful, not just for multinational firms, but also for small and medium-sized enterprises with limited budgets.

Using case examples and practical recommendations, this book conveys fundamental aspects of professional corporate security organization and creates a solid foundation for security-conscious behavior when traveling worldwide.

Europe's New Antiterror King

Jean-Claude Juncker surprised London by giving Julian King a high-profile Commission post in counterterrorism. The European Commission's decision to give Britain the security portfolio plays to the UK's strengths and may ensure it continues to boost Europe's counterterrorism efforts post-Brexit. Jean-Claude Juncker took his time deciding what job to give Julian King, a former British ambassador to France, before choosing "the security union." Sources involved in the decision said it also allowed Juncker to take responsibility away from Dimitris Avramopoulos of Greece, whose portfolio -- migration, home affairs and citizenship -- includes counterterrorism.

On 26 July, EU privacy regulators endorsed a new self-certifying U.S. data transfer pact but highlighted a number of outstanding issues. The so-called Privacy Shield allows companies to transfer the data of EU citizens to servers based in the United States. The transatlantic trade is worth billions for firms but ran into problems following revelations of U.S.-led mass surveillance on EU citizens three years ago. The new pact replaces the Safe Harbour agreement, which was invalidated by the European Court of Justice last October.

The objective of this project is to establish a comprehensive list of cybersecurity policies, tools, standards, measures and provide recommendations to enhance the level of security of smart cars. The study focuses on the assets inside the cars as well as on data exchanges related to safety.


