UK Chapter Session: Police and Military Transitions

The ASIS International United Kingdom Chapter held a Police and Military transitions session in advance of its Summer Seminar in London on 14 June. Having successfully run a similar session at the Counter Terror Expo, the chapter wanted to give attendees the chance to take advantage of the networking opportunities at the start of the Summer Seminar, and if time permitted, to stay and get a feel for what else ASIS had to offer.

Run by Scott Paterson, CPP, PSP, ICTS Consulting, and UK Chapter board member Dawn Holmes, CPP, the session was an interactive event that offered advice and guidance for those considering the transition to security. Scott gave an informative presentation that helped listeners to define what they wanted -- whether it was to top up pensions or make security a new career -- as well as practicalities such as relocating and the importance of having reasonable expectations.

Recruiters were invited to discuss personal branding and how to survive the CV sift. James Butler, Mike Hurst, and Graham Bassett emphasised the importance of doing research, ensuring that jargon is left at the door, and that candidates are talking a corporate language.

Several long-serving ASIS members with police and military backgrounds attended. Andy Williams, CPP; Dave Clark, CPP, PCI, PSP; Dr. Mike McDonagh; and Corin Dennison, CPP, discussed their transition experiences. Transferring skills into the correct sectors of the corporate world was explored. Williams also personally agreed to meet with anyone interested to discuss options one to one. The support available was also discussed, noting the significant difference between the support the former military gets compared to the police services, reviewing the groups that do support and advise the police, and offering help.

Feedback from attendees was extremely positive and the UK Chapter will be looking to put on these events more regularly, and also to use this format for other groups looking at transitioning -- for example, guarding to management -- to provide support and utilise the wealth of experience of the UK Chapter's membership.

As part of the ongoing activities of the ASIS International Spain Chapter during its 35th anniversary year, a delegation from the chapter board carried out a visit to the Private Security Central Unit (USCP) of the National Police to deliver a certificate award. The USCP is the national police branch responsible for all private security activities in Spain, including the control and licensing of private security companies who provide services such as security systems and protecting cash in transit, as well as private security personnel and inspection activities, amongst others. According to 2014 data, private security in Spain is provided by approximately 1,500 companies (Twenty-one per cent of these are exclusively dedicated to manned guarding) and 75,000 licensed security officers.

USCP, which originated in the early 1980s, falls under the Public Order General Commissariat of the Spanish National Police.

The ASIS International Austria Chapter met on 23 June at the premises of Tele2 in Vienna. Attendees were greeted by Chapter Chair Werner Preining and the host of the evening, Sebastian Puchner, fraud and security officer at Tele2. The meeting started with an update from the chair on ASIS activities and chapter administration, followed by an introduction of the hosts at Tele2, which operates in nine European countries providing communication solutions and maintain 450 technical sites.

Puchner continued with a presentation titled "Fraud and Security Management in the Telecom Industry." Several common but cunning fraud schemes were presented, starting with distributed denial of services, followed by child sexual abuse, premium service numbers and wangiri numbers. Puchner then discussed ways to combat these schemes from coming to fruition.

Another issue discussed was the stealing of phones and associated SIM-cards without a SIM-lock. Barcelona is a city with some of the most frequent cases of mobile phones being stolen and used for fraud. Revenues up to €1,000 per hour can be created by skilled criminals. Beside PBX hacking many other activities need to be constantly monitored by telecommunication experts.

The presentation also covered telecommunication legislation in Austria. Data breaches, for example, must be reported within 24 hours. At times, Puchner said, it can become difficult to maintain net neutrality and provide security. Security business continuity is also an important issue, as it is required and regulated by law.

EU Overview

New EU Directive Requires Critical Infrastructure to Improve Cybersecurity

On 6 July, The European Parliament has passed the new network and information security (NIS) directive, placing minimum standards for cyber-security on critical infrastructure operators.

Companies which supply essential services - such as energy, transport, banking, health, or digital services such as cloud services and search engines - will be required to achieve minimum standards of cyber-security under new EU-wide rules adopted by the EU Parliament.

The EU network and information security (NIS) directive sets common cyber-security standards and aims to step up cooperation among EU countries and service providers. According to its supporters, it will help prevent attacks on EU countries' interconnected infrastructure.

Does Crime Still Pay?



From 2010 to 2014, 2.2 per cent of the estimated proceeds of crime were provisionally seized or frozen, and 1.1 per cent of the criminal profits were finally confiscated at EU level, according to a recent report penned by Europol's Asset Recovery Unit, in cooperation with the Asset Recovery Offices of EU Member States. This report, the first of its kind, shows that the amount of money currently being recovered in the EU is only a small proportion of estimated criminal proceeds: 98.9 per cent of estimated criminal profits are not confiscated and remain at the disposal of criminals. That means that around 50 per cent of all provisionally seized or frozen assets are ultimately confiscated.

This study also estimates that the annual value of provisionally seized/frozen assets in the EU is around €2.4 billion, with about €1.2 billion finally confiscated each year at EU level.

Cybersecurity Research Fund Accused of Protectionism

The European Commission has earmarked €450 million to fund companies working on cybersecurity in a bid to slash the growing number of attacks on private firms and governments. Estimates from the Commission point to annual damages worth up to €500 billion resulting from technology security attacks worldwide. Under a new agreement backed by the EU executive, more than 100 companies pledged to pay into a fund for cybersecurity research. Combined with Commission funds from its Horizon 2020 programme, the group predicts it will set aside €1.8 billion over the next three years. But some people involved in the security fund have ruffled feathers by arguing that companies from outside of Europe shouldn't be allowed to join.

Facebook Allowed to Collect Data on Nonusers in Belgium



An appeals court in Belgium earlier this week ruled in favour of allowing Facebook to amass data on people in the country who are not registered users of the social media giant. The ruling reverses a previous court decision that had imposed a tracking ban on Facebook following revelations it was collecting information on non-Facebook users and others who were not logged into their accounts.

Paris Attacks: Call to Overhaul French Intelligence Services



French intelligence services should be overhauled in the wake of last year's terror attacks in Paris, a parliamentary commission of inquiry has recommended. Various services should be merged into a single agency, the commission said. Commission president Georges Fenech proposed a body similar to the U.S. National Counterterrorism Center. The January and November attacks, which killed 147 people in all, prompted criticism of the security response.

Migration, Terrorism, and Austerity Help Security Contractors Prosper



Refugees arriving on Aegean Islands are whisked to "hotspots" -- registration centres run by the European Asylum Support Office (EASO). It is often a traumatic moment. Those who fear being sent back to Turkey can turn angry or violent. "We have had a number of riots, staff have had to be evacuated quickly," says an EASO spokesman, Jean-Pierre Schembri. So, for the first time, a private security firm, G4S, has been

contracted to guard the hotspots, backing up the Greek police. "We felt we needed additional security," Schembri adds.


