As part of an ASIS International awareness programme, the Moscow, Russia Chapter leadership teamed up with the Association of European Businesses in Russia and the Russo-American Chamber of Commerce to organise two events on corporate investigations for managers of multinational businesses with operations in the former Soviet Union. The events took place on 12 May and 2 June with a combined audience of more than 100 individuals.

Dmitry Budanov, regional vice president of ASIS Region 9F, and Timothy Bobak, Young Professionals lead for the Russia Chapter, presented at the events, not only to raise awareness of fraud, but also to guide top management through the steps required to adequately respond to crisis incidents. This is necessary as there is a lack of know-how about security best practices in the management pool of most companies. Accordingly, security industry leadership must be committed to demonstrating that security personnel can add value throughout the business cycle. Fraud case studies were used to illustrate the value of integrated responses to threats to business continuity, morale, profits, and criminal proceedings.

ASIS members also took part in a panel discussion at the annual meeting of the Franco-Russian Chamber of Commerce to raise awareness of brand protection and anticounterfeiting measures. This effort focused on product design, legal action, investigative procedures, and legislative lobbying to pursue counterfeiters across the Eurasian Customs Union.

Security breaches and crime remain a hot topic for international businesses in the Russian Federation and former Soviet Union, as the decline in economic growth has prompted an increase in crime and a reduction in profits, meaning that each major threat has greater potential consequences for company operations and long term goals.

The ASIS International Ireland Chapter recently held two educational seminars. The first was hosted by Mylan Pharmaceuticals at their Dublin office and featured presentations on terrorism, the crisis management team's role in employee kidnapping prevention, and project management in data centres.

Sheelagh Brady of SAR Consultancy, who has a law enforcement background and extensive international experience, discussed traditional versus new forms of terrorism, as well as the risk of lone wolf or coordinated attacks. She also stressed the importance of table-top exercises and training.

Todd Clements of Fifty Talents, gave a fascinating presentation on employee kidnapping prevention and the role an organisation's crisis management team during a kidnap incident, which was drawn from his law enforcement background. Dan Verity of Guidepost Solutions discussed data centre security project management, providing a process for security managers that would assist when tasked with managing such a project.

The second event was hosted by Tyco at their global headquarters in Cork. The meeting was opened by Donal Sullivan, vice president, Tyco International, who provided an overview of the company's operations in the city. A presentation by Lieutenant Commander Tony Geraghty of the Naval Service, Defence Forces Ireland, followed. This provided an operational commander's perspective on operations in the Mediterranean in support of the migrant crisis, together with the risks and challenges associated with such operations.

The French interior ministry, which is in charge of security, recently released a new mobile emergency alert app. The app was launched a few days before the start of the UEFA Euro 2016 championship but it will remain operative after that.

The goal of the app is to alert people, via geotracking or after having set preferred cities, in case of emergencies such as a terrorist attacks and disasters such as floods.

The content comes from official sources and will be operated by the ministry services.

Executive Protection Council Launched

The ASIS International Executive Protection Council, the newest addition to the ASIS International roster of 34 councils, has been approved by the ASIS Board of Directors.

Members of the council work in executive protection (EP) full time, oversee EP departments, or advise clients on EP concerns, according to the council's chair, Robert Oatman, CPP. Senior managers from Fortune 500 companies as well as from privately held companies that provide EP services to the private and government sectors serve on the council.

Impetus to form the council began in 2013, when ASIS offered a certificate in Executive Protection.

While Oatman had taught a two-day program for ASIS on executive protection since 1998, growing interest in the course and the certificate lead to the formation of an ad hoc council in 2014.

With its formal status now secured, council members will focus in earnest on their mission and goals, which include providing education and resources on professional executive protection and establishing EP as a business enabler to keep protectees safe and productive. In the short term, the council will foster its active leadership, add new members, enhance content to the council's website, and present a webinar. Longer term, the council hopes to develop an executive protection standard, and has formed a subcommittee to look into that possibility.

International interest in EP is evidenced by the diverse backgrounds of the students that attend the ASIS EP programs. Many are currently working in the field, but all want to learn more about the art of executive protection. In addition, says Oatman, corporations have realized the value of EP services. As a result, EP has become a viable career path for individuals transitioning from law enforcement or government positions.

Cost-Effective Risk Reduction and Compliance Assurance for Physical Security

Banks, financial institutions, companies managing critical national infrastructure such as utility providers, nuclear power plants, and data centres are mandated to ensure compliance against government and industry regulations for several areas of their businesses. The risks associated with failure to comply are related to the financial and reputational profile of any organization and therefore are taken seriously across all levels and areas.

Physical access governance is one such area, which ensures that:

1. The right person has physical access to the right place at the right times.
2. All required vetting and validation of any person who is being provisioned physical access has been done in accordance with the security policy of the organization.
3. Necessary approvals are received before physical access for any person is provisioned for a particular area-for example, critical or high security areas such as data centres.
4. Required privileges, training, and certifications-for example, health and safety-are in place in accordance with the security policy of an area.
5. Physical access is revoked or suspended per the defined security policy.

To measure and assure compliance, organizations must collect, manage, analyse, and report on data and processes during the lifecycle of any person on site. This involves collaboration between several departments concerned with physical security, IT, risk, and business continuity.

A physical identity and access management (PIAM) solution could help physical security achieve these objectives in a cost-effective manner through automation and integration.

An ideal PIAM solution is one that can allow organizations to collect and manage the flow of data across disparate systems, such as different physical access controls, as well as presents the capability to automate auditing and reporting of related processes and workflows for all areas, employees, contractors, and visitors. A return on investment in the form of operational cost savings and identifiable risk reduction through automated auditing and reporting should be carefully assessed by each organization per their compliance mandates, process complexities and existing infrastructure. Finally, successful implementation of a PIAM solution is the key to any such initiative and therefore it is highly recommended as a well-referenced, out-of-the-box solution.

EU Overview

New EU Digital Laws a Boon to Cybersecurity Insurance



Newly passed EU laws on data protection and cybersecurity could be a boon for insurance companies, which could pick up more clients once the rules go into effect in 2018.

Under the data protection regulation and the network and information security (NIS) directive, the EU's new cybersecurity law, companies will be required to report to authorities if their digital networks are attacked by hackers. Both laws were approved earlier this year.

There is limited data about how many companies in Europe have already purchased insurance policies to cover hacking attacks. Insurance companies and researchers say that's because the market is still too young.

EU, U.S. Sign Umbrella Agreement on Data Protection

The European Union and the United States signed a deal on 2 June to protect personal data transferred across the Atlantic in a bid to fight crime and terrorism.

The so-called umbrella agreement signed in Amsterdam follows five years of talks that were hobbled by European concerns about revelations of large-scale U.S. snooping.

"It will improve cooperation between the United States and European law enforcement authorities when combatting serious crime and terrorism," Dutch Justice Minister Ard van der Steur said at a signing ceremony during the Dutch six-month presidency of the EU.

"It will advance the full respect for fundamental rights whenever personal data is being transferred between us," he said at the ceremony with U.S. Attorney General Loretta Lynch.

Commission Adopts New Rules in Wake of Costa Concordia Disaster



The European Commission has adopted a series of legal proposals aimed at simplifying and modifying the safety and security framework for passenger boats in EU waters, EurActiv Spain reports.

Updating the legislation has been a reaction to "lessons learned, including accidents and the evolution of technology," noted the Commission, which insisted that the safety of more than 400 million passengers that set sail in EU waters every year would be guaranteed in a more effective and efficient manner.




The ASIS China 2016 Conference will take place from 14 to 15 November.
