The ASIS International Benelux Chapter welcomed 100 security experts on Thursday 13 October in Antwerp, with "Connectivity" as the theme. Suzanne Oyen, global corporate security manager at Swift, chaired the event.

Wilfried Covent, security expert at Brussels Airport Company, gave his personal insights on the attacks on 22 March. His story and experiences of coping with that situation, personally and professionally, left a lasting impression. Wilfried shared with us his lessons learned and best practices.

Tom and Katelijn Nijsmans of The Tipping Point explained the fundamentals of management styles, shown by mathematical axes with four criteria: give space vs. take space and facts vs. emotion. Everyone has personal preferences and characteristics, which will show a colour that represents your style. Knowing which management colour matches your characteristics, and also of the person in front of you, will make connecting to the person easier.

Ken Livingstone, director of training at Linx International Group (UK), explained the importance of communication and connectivity. Connecting with one another is much easier when we communicate well. Doing so, we can generate other views and opinions which will contribute to higher goals.

Max Remerie, quartermaster of The Hague Security Delta, detailed the role IT security plays in our daily lives, the role it will have in the future, and which priorities it should have.

Werner Cooreman, CPP, PSP, group security director at Solvay, focused on global security in multicultural and international organisations. He talked about working across differences between cultures in order to meet corporate security objectives.

The meeting opened with updates on chapter and global ASIS activities. An important announcement was made to congratulate chapter member William Mubanga who earned his PCI certification - the first in Austria.

The highlight of the evening was Czech's presentation, "Protecting against Drones." Since 2014, there are some legal restrictions regarding the use of drones, such as no flights above 30 meters in altitude and a gross weight of less than 150 kg for unmanned flying objects. Drones are used for a lot of different tasks within the military and the civil field. Some of the many applications are traffic control, package delivery, land survey, and healthcare.

Drones are not limited to airborne application but are also built as amphibians, for underwater operations, as well as acting as worms or climbing vertical walls. Bomb disposal robots also fall into the category of drones. Only imagination sets a limit to the application of a drone. For example, videos are available on social media showing a chainsaw drone and a remote-controlled submachine gun that eliminates targets at close range.

The main weakness in protecting from drones is detecting drones entering a property. There are several systems, such as geo-fencing, jammers, lasers, interception drones within high security areas, and a net-cannon that shoots an unfolding net and catches the trespassing drone while in flight, grounding it. But most of these systems need to be improved to stay abreast of the steadily advancing technology of the drone production.

In summary, national authorities are challenged to establish regulations for the safe and legal handling of drones as well as protecting law-abiding citizens. These will of course not hinder criminals and terrorists in turning to these interesting tools for use in their illegal activities.

The presentation was followed by networking and drinks offered by the host.

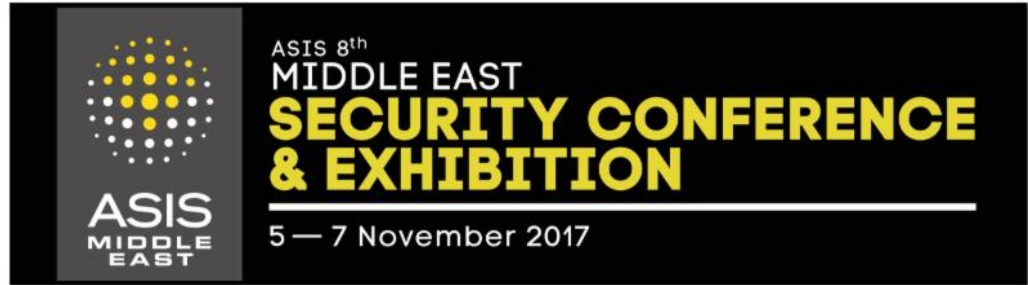
