

The Peace Palace is often called the seat of international law because it houses the International Court of Justice (the principal judicial body of the United Nations), the Permanent Court of Arbitration, the Hague Academy of International Law, and the extensive Peace Palace Library. In addition to hosting these institutions, the palace is also a regular venue for special events in international policy and law.

The palace was originally built to provide a symbolic home for the Permanent Court of Arbitration, a court to end wars that was created by treaty at the 1899 Hague Peace Conference.

The idea of the palace started with a discussion in 1900 between the Russian diplomat Friedrich Martens and the U.S. diplomat

Andrew White, over providing a home for the Permanent Court of Arbitration (PCA), which was established through the first Hague Peace Conference in 1899. White contacted his friend, the philanthropist Andrew Carnegie, about this idea. Carnegie had reservations, and at first he was only interested in donating money for the establishment of a Library of International Law. White, however, was able to convince Carnegie, and in 1903 Carnegie agreed to donate the U.S. \$1.5 million needed for a Peace Temple that would house the PCA, as well as to endow a Library of International Law.

At first, Carnegie simply wanted to donate the money directly to the Dutch Queen Wilhelmina for building the palace, but legal problems prohibited this, and in November 1903, the Carnegie Foundation was founded to manage the construction, ownership, and maintenance of the palace. This foundation is still responsible for this today.

ASIS Austria Chapter Hold First Meeting of 2014

On 13 February, the ASIS International Austria Chapter held its first meeting of the year at Sberbank in Vienna. The event was attended by ten members and four guests at the invitation of Erik Maragoni, director of security for the European operations of Sberbank.

After members had been welcomed by Chapter Chair Werner Preining, CPP, the programme continued with a presentation from Erik Maragoni.

Sberbank, which is the Central Bank of the Russian Federation, employs about 250,000 people within the federation as well as 4,500 employees in Central and Eastern European countries. It is the third biggest bank in Europe. In Vienna, Sberbank acts as a holding company for the 280 branches set up within 8 countries. Security and security-related fields like crisis management and business continuity are not only taken seriously but are considered major priorities. Other issues of importance are a security awareness programme and the development of an online banking platform. One major aim within the infrastructure is to concentrate on business needs and to make security a supporting structure.

France Chapter Young Professionals Committee and ANAJ-IHEDN Hold Joint Event

The Young Professionals Committee of the ASIS International France Chapter organised a conference in partnership with ANAJ-IHEDN, a French young professionals defense association. The event, titled "Diverse perspectives on the management of security in transport," was held on 29 January at the Military School in Paris.

There were approximately 250 attendees, including security professionals, law enforcement officials, and citizens. The event also gathered a large number of students and young professionals interested in transport security.

Transportation of goods or people is part of everyday life. However, we are usually unaware of the logistics, the operators, and the varied risks. Security has become a major issue and a key factor in operational continuity for businesses and many state sectors.

The conference started with an introduction provided by François Mattens, chair of ANAJ-IHEDN, and Henri Hemery, Young Professionals liaison for the France Chapter. The programme continued with four presentations that broadly covered the security of urban transport, road logistics, and air and maritime transport.

Jean Marc Novaro, CSO of the Régie Autonome des Transports Parisiens (RAPT), made a presentation on security in urban transport. Novaro explained the security risks for urban transport, which vary widely from incivility to major terrorist attacks. He detailed the measures and policies that ensure the security of public transport users and RATP employees. Novaro described the cooperation between the security department of RATP and the French police. He also stressed that safety incidents can have a great impact on the security of public transport users.

Arnaud Conrad, national security and safety manager of EXAPAQ, continued with a presentation on security for road transport. Conrad discussed how road transport companies in France are united within an association and how they collaborate with French police forces. He explained the typology of road transport security risks in France, and detailed the cost of thefts and attacks.

Charles Yvinec, CSO of Air France, spoke on air transport security. Yvinec reviewed the different international air transport security regulations and conventions, and explained some of the ways that security is handled by Air France.

Finally, Simon Delfau, security manager of CMA CGM gave a presentation on Maritime Security. Delfau discussed the four major types of risks treated in maritime security: piracy, stowaways, traffic, and terrorism. He said that since the 2008 Somali pirate attack on the French luxury Yacht Le Ponant in the Gulf of Aden, CMA CGM vessels have been attacked 33 times unsuccessfully. He also discussed mitigation measures and rules implemented by CMA CGM, which can include armed forces on board as well as active and passive organisational and technical solutions.

Commission Welcomes Agreement to Protect Euro from Counterfeiting

The European Commission has welcomed the political agreement on the proposal to better protect the euro from counterfeiting through EU-wide criminal law measures. The agreement follows two meetings between the commission, the European Parliament, and the Council of Ministers endorsed by member states on 19 February. It was rubber-stamped on 20 February by a vote in the European Parliament's Civil Liberties, Justice, and Home Affairs Committee. This breakthrough shows that Europe is willing to take all measures necessary to fight counterfeiting of the euro. Member states will have to make sure that such behaviour is punishable with effective and deterrent sanctions everywhere in Europe.

Vice-President Viviane Reding said, "This agreement will strengthen confidence in our most valuable asset: the euro. It will also help protect honest businesses and citizens from ending up with fake money in their pockets. It is a strong and unified response to protecting our currency and clamping down on the criminals that threaten it. One thing we do regret however: that co-legislators could not agree on the introduction of minimum sanctions for the most serious offences. The guarantee of a minimum 6-month jail sentence would have been an additional deterrent to crimes against our common currency."

The agreed-upon legislation aims to crack down on criminals who counterfeit euro notes and coins. The new measures strengthen cross-border investigations -- for example, by allowing investigative tools for organised crime or serious cases can also be used in cases of counterfeiting currency. The new instrument also introduces common maximum penalties, including imprisonment of at least eight years for production and five years for distribution for the most serious counterfeiting offences. Further, the law will enable an early analysis of seized forgeries during judicial proceedings to better detect counterfeit euros in circulation and to prevent their circulation.

The agreement will need to be endorsed by the plenary of the European Parliament, which is expected to occur by April, and by ministers on the Council.

European Parliament Votes to Crack Down on Crime Profits

On 25 February, the European Parliament adopted the European Commission's proposed directive on freezing and confiscating the proceeds of crime in the EU.

The commission made ambitious proposals and the agreed-upon EU-wide rules will fill important gaps that are exploited by organised criminal groups.

Proposed rules will enhance the ability of member states to confiscate assets that have been transferred to third parties and assets which are not directly linked to a specific crime, but which clearly result from other criminal activities by the convicted person.

The directive also makes it easier to confiscate criminal assets, even when a criminal conviction is not possible because the suspect is ill or is a fugitive and ensures that competent authorities can temporarily freeze assets that risk disappearing if no action is taken. Moreover, it recommends that confiscated assets should be reused for public and social purposes.

"I trust that these new rules will help us taking on criminal threats together. Clearly law enforcement and judicial authorities will have greater means to recover a more significant proportion of the illegal profits that end up in the criminals' pockets or are reinvested into legal assets or activities. Facilitating asset confiscation will hamper criminal activities and deter criminality by showing that crime does not pay," said Cecilia Malmström, EU Commissioner for Home Affairs.

European Cybercrime Centre: A Look at Its First Year

Just over a year ago, on 11 January, 2013, the European Cybercrime Centre (EC3) at Europol opened its doors for business. Created to strengthen the European Union's law enforcement community response to cybercrime, EC3's brief was to help protect European citizens and businesses against existing and future cyber threats.

In its first year, EC3 has been called upon to support many large-scale, cross-border cybercrime investigations, demonstrating the clear benefit of law enforcement authorities joining forces internationally to tackle this rapidly evolving area of crime. Investigations that might have stayed at a domestic level, with limited cooperation and impact, have been made truly international by bringing the expertise, technical facilities, intelligence, and partners together.

In addition to working with law enforcement cybercrime teams and relevant EU bodies, relationships forged with key partners such as computer emergency response teams, Internet and financial services companies, the antimalware industry, software manufacturers, and academia, have ensured that the effect of law enforcement operations -- and the impact on cybercrime -- is being leveraged to its full potential, despite the current limited resources available. A strong programme board, involving key actors in the areas of cybercrime and cyber security, provides strategic

guidance and ensures the alignment of EC3's activities with other partner organisations. As such, a broad, holistic approach is taken with partners like ENISA, Eurojust, CEPOL, CERT-EU, and Interpol.

As well as its crucial operational support, EC3 has delivered important products and services to EU law enforcement authorities in the past year, such as training and capacity building, strategic analysis and digital forensic support.

For the future, EC3's focus will rest issues such as criminal cooperation in the digital underground economy and the challenges brought about by cybercrime's borderless and anonymous nature.

New Modus Operandi for Cargo Theft from Lorries

Europol warns about a new phenomenon where criminals use a "Trojan horse" method of gaining access to delivery lorries by concealing themselves in large wooden boxes. The boxes marked "Fragile" are picked-up by parcel delivery services. Once the box is inside a lorry en route to its destination, the criminals exit the box to steal valuable items inside the lorry such as jewellery, phones, or electronics.

Accomplices following from a distance then simulate an accident to stop the vehicle, enabling those hidden inside to escape via holes cut out of the vehicle roof.

Cargo thefts involving simulated accidents are quite common, and thefts from moving trucks have also been reported on a regular basis. However, the Trojan horse modus operandi outlined above is a new phenomenon.

Europol has issued an early warning notification regarding this particular modus operandi, reported by Spanish law enforcement authorities, to all police forces in Europe.

French Senate Discusses Proposal for a European Public Prosecutor

Euractiv reported that former French Justice Minister Robert Badinter gave his support to the European Commission proposal for a European public prosecutor at a hearing in the French Senate. The discussion followed a vote at the European Parliament backing the commission's proposal.

The commission launched the initiative last July to integrate more uniform crime-fighting standards into national law systems. However, Britain's ruling Conservatives rejected the idea of the

creation of a European Public Prosecutor, leaving the remaining 27 EU members with the option of continuing without Britain, using the so-called "enhanced cooperation" procedure.

In addition, there are two opposing views on the most suitable way to set up a common public prosecutor.

The European Commission foresees the creation of a body led by a European prosecutor appointed by the EU Council for a non-renewable eight-year mandate. He or she would be empowered to effectively engage in prosecution actions and would be assisted by deputy prosecutors, also appointed by the council, and deputy prosecutors in the member states.

On the other side, France and Germany consider that it is far too early for the commission model and that it would be preferable to give Eurojust more authority to deal with cross-border crimes rather than create a new European body.

According to Badinter, the second approach is more appropriate especially since the United Kingdom is opposed to the proposal. Badinter adds that the proposal is necessary, as criminals take advantage of the difference in the judicial systems in the EU to commit cross-border crimes in their most dangerous forms.
