### Bomb Blast in Bahrain Kills Three Policemen

*The Gulf Times* reported that a protester threw a tear gas canister during clashes in the village of Daih, west of Manama, on March 3, killing three policemen.

First Lieutenant Tariq al-Shehi died along with two members of the Bahraini police force. He is the first Gulf officer to be reported killed since forces from the region stepped in to support Bahrain's security forces in March 2011.

The explosion is the most serious assault on the security forces in terms of casualties since bomb attacks became frequent in the kingdom. It occurred as hundreds of Bahrainis marched in a procession to mark the final day of mourning for a 23-year-old man who died in custody a week before. The interior ministry had said the man, who was detained in December 2013 and had been accused of smuggling weapons, had died of an illness.

Bahrain quelled the 2011 protests, but small-scale demonstrations remain frequent and often lead to clashes with security forces.

### Risk of Cyberattacks on the Rise in Middle East

According to *The Saudi Gazette*, a report recently released by CISCO stresses that Middle East businesses face unprecedented levels of cyberattacks.

Cisco's 2014 *Annual Security Report* emphasizes that the Middle East's energy, oil, and gas sectors have seen a sharp rise in malware attacks. However, specific business sectors besides energy, such as pharmaceutical, chemical, electronics manufacturing, agriculture, and mining, are also affected.

"Organizations across the Middle East and Africa must realize that it is no longer if they will be targeted by cyberattacks, but rather when," said Dr. Tarig Enaya, managing director of Cisco Saudi Arabia. "Chief information security officers face growing pressure to protect terabytes of data on an increasingly porous network, manage information safely especially on the cloud, and evaluate the risks of working with third-party vendors for specialized solutions -- all in the wake of shrinking budgets and leaner IT teams," he added.

The Middle East and Africa region is posting strong adoption of smart devices and cloud computing. However, while increasing mobility is rapidly enhancing daily lives and businesses, it is also driving more complex security threats and solutions. Businesses across the Middle East are at high risk, with 65 percent of employees not understanding the security risks of using personal devices to the workplace, according to Cisco.

As a result, cybercriminals are increasingly attacking Internet infrastructure rather than individual computers or devices, with password and credential theft, hidden-in-plain-sight infiltrations, and breaching and stealing data.

Finally, the report indicates a shortage of more than 1 million security professionals across the globe in 2014, as most organizations do not have the people or systems to continuously monitor extended networks or detect infiltrations, and then apply protections, in a timely and effective manner.

### Increasing Turmoil Forces BP to Leave Libya

Value Walk reported that BP has abandoned its plan to explore Libya's Ghadames basin due to security concerns.

BP's exploration and production sharing agreement with Libya signed in 2007 spans onshore acreage in Ghadames, near the border of Libya, Algeria, and Tunisia as well as offshore acreage in the central Sirte basin.

A security review in June 2013 relating to the onshore exploration drilling program revealed that BP could not deliver the project safely and securely on time. BP is evaluating alternative

approaches and is progressing with offshore plans, which carry low safety risks.

Since Gaddafi was ousted in 2011, uncertainty in Libya has been on the rise. Attacks on foreigners have become more common, hindering much of the country's oil exports for months.

Increasing turmoil and tough contract terms have impelled oil firms to reconsider their Libya plans. Apart from BP, other oil majors have been affected by the Libya unrest. Companies such as ExxonMobil cut its staff and operations in Libya in September 2013, while Royal Dutch Shell withdrew exploration on two blocks in 2012 owing to poor results. Marathon Oil Corporation also tried farming out from one of Libya's top oil ventures, but the deal was blocked by the country.

### **Smart Technologies and IT Security to Drive IT Investments From Middle East and Africa Oil and Gas Companies**

A report released by the International Data Corporation (IDC) highlights that IT spending by oil and gas companies across the Middle East and Africa (MEA) in 2014 will be primarily driven by ambitious infrastructure investment plans, a desire to modernize operational processes, and the quest to add more value to the services delivered to end-users, Zawya reports.

Oil and gas organizations in the MEA region continued to accelerate their IT investments in 2013, with 3rd Platform technologies such as cloud computing, Big Data analytics, and mobility gaining significant traction among large oil companies.

Arthur Melet, a senior research analyst at IDC Energy Insights MEA, said, "The biggest stories in 2014 will be about how Middle East and Africa oil and gas companies will include high-potential innovative technologies such as Big Data, analytics, and cloud-based computing within their existing IT strategies, and how they will prepare for upcoming ICT threats such as attacks on industrial control systems."

IDC also indicates that smart oil and gas technologies, which started to significantly impact the region about 10 years ago, are clearly here to stay. However, IDC notices that changes in the applications of innovative technologies in the industry has begun.

"Many companies are currently trying to go beyond the not-so-new concepts of digital oilfields or integrated operations, initiating a transition toward a more flexible approach that has been referred to as the 'resilient oilfield,'" says Melet. "Also, oil and gas

companies are starting to realize the potential value of smart technologies outside of the upstream segment. We have noticed increased interest among Middle East and Africa oil and gas

companies for such technologies in the downstream segment, including digital pipeline integrity management systems."
