Applications accepted between 1 April and 31 May 2018.

PURPOSE: The ASIS Foundation is committed to supporting ASIS members by providing scholarships that help individuals achieve their professional goals in security and related professions. Through a partnership between the ASIS Foundation and the Transition Ad Hoc Council, scholarships will be offered in 2018 to provide a set of certification reference materials, an online certification review course (available for CPP and PSP only), and a voucher that will enable the scholarship recipient to apply to take the exam for a specific ASIS Certification.

To qualify, you must:

- Be an active law enforcement officer
- Be an ASIS member in good standing
- Be prepared to meet the requirements of the desired ASIS board certification

Your complete application must include:

- 1. Nomination letter signed by department/agency chief or director
- 2. A 250 to 300-word essay to explain why you are a strong candidate and the reason you are applying for this scholarship (1-page, double-spaced, 12 pt. Arial / Times New Roman)
- 3. Resume or CV
